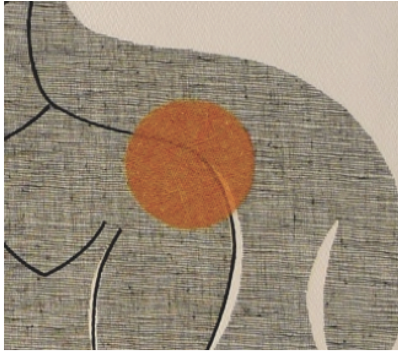

Motel by Joachim Brohm shows a variety of street signs you might see in a city.

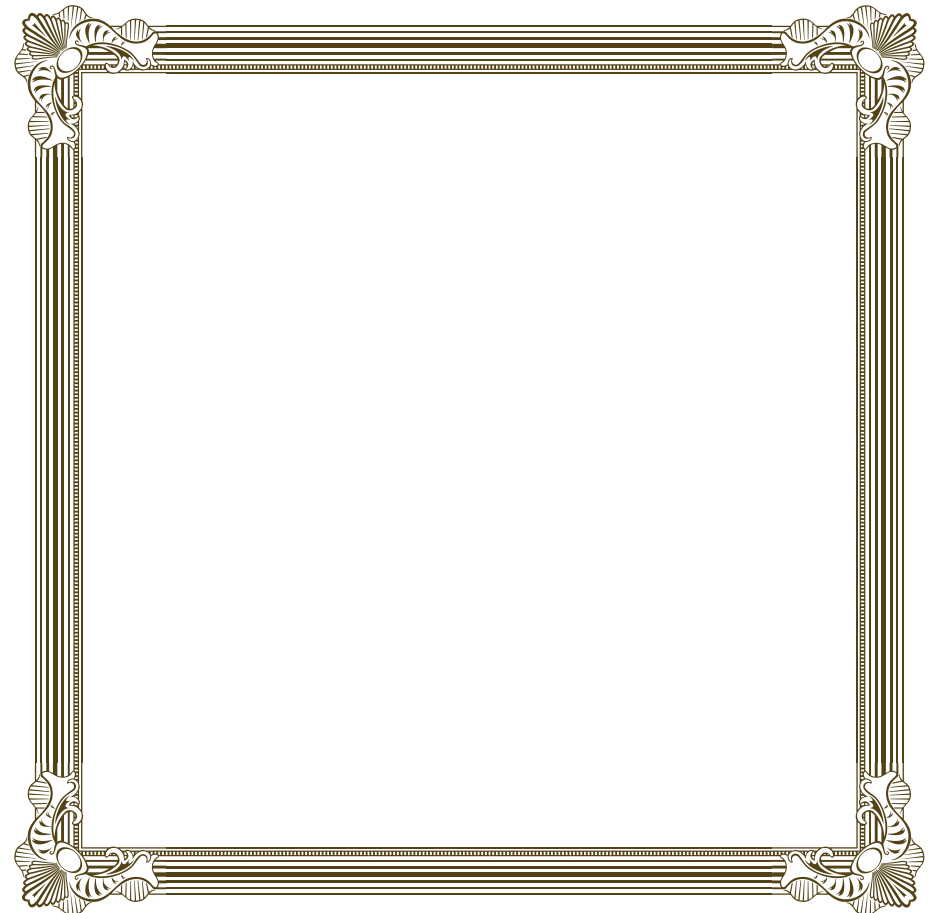


Here are other signs you would see in a city.

Where have you seen birds like this?

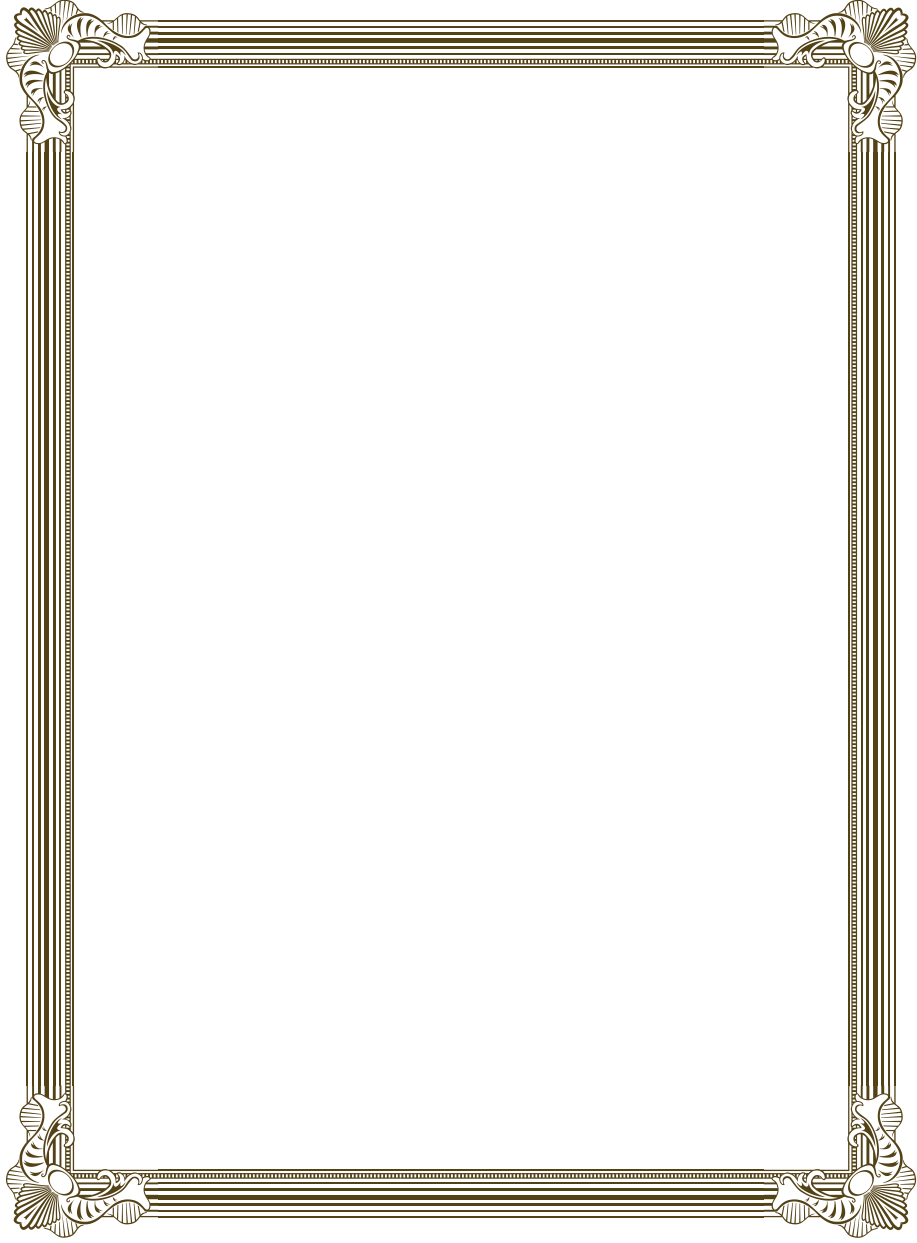

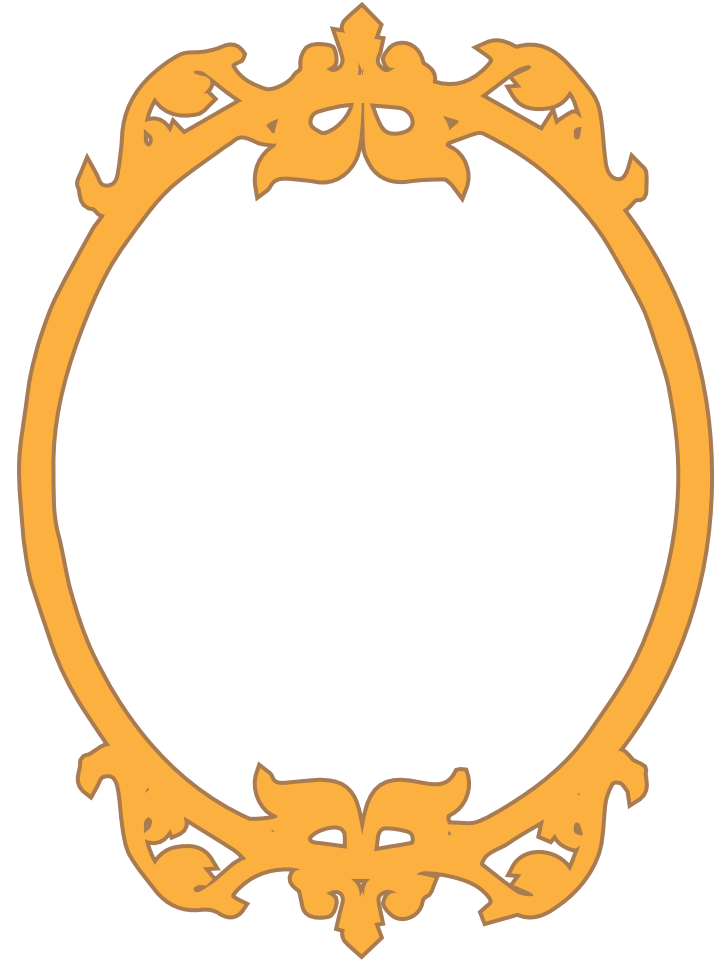


Find *Flirt* by Helen Frankenthaler.

Flirt is an example of abstract art.

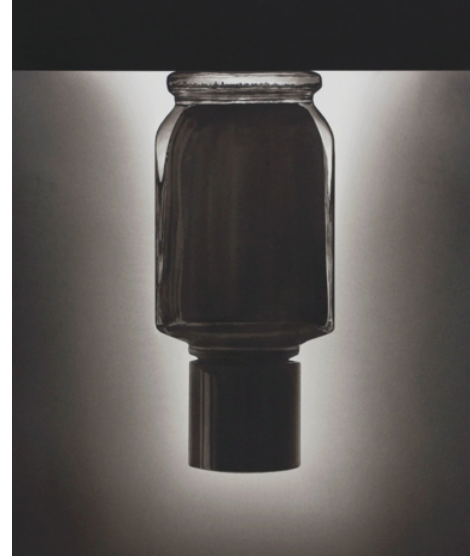

Draw a portrait of one of your relatives in the frame below and tell a story about that relative.



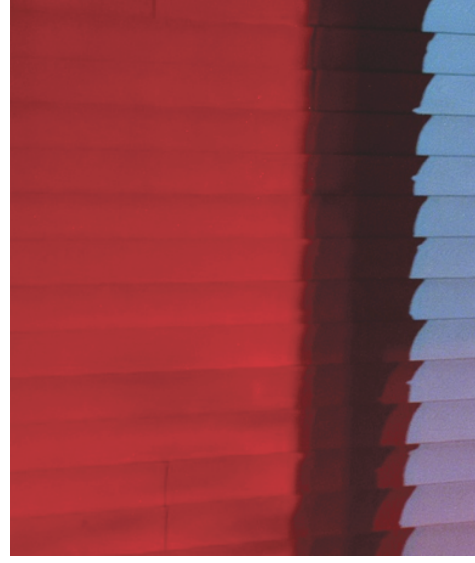
