1. PURPOSE

1.1. This policy establishes the use of Broad Consent and its process.

2. REVISIONS FROM PREVIOUS VERSION

2.1. None

3. POLICY

3.1. At this time, the MU IRB will not mandate nor implement the institutional use of Broad Consent.

3.1.1. Exemption categories 7 and 8, which rely on Broad Consent, will not be utilized at MU IRB.

3.1.2. Projects seeking subject permission for the collection and storage of identifiable private information/biospecimens for future secondary use can do so through the following processes:

(1) Study-specific consent and IRB review

(2) IRB waiver of consent (as eligible) and IRB review

(3) Exemption #4

(4) De-identification to remove the research activity from Common Rule purview and not require IRB review or consent
