Guest Speakers: Chelsea Malacara, Sustainability and Energy Management Coordinator

- Discussion was held around Marquette move out and local news coverage.
 - Last year, a student won the Brewed Ideas Challenge Social Innovation prize pitching an idea called Marquette Yard Sale aimed at reducing waste during move in and move out
 - Over the past six months, a group of stakeholders from facilities, sustainability and the 707 Hub put together an Explorer Grant Challenge proposal to launch a move-in/ move-out program that would eventually be cost neutral-the program was funded.
 - The idea is to collect items from residence halls, then sort and store them over the summer.

- In the fall, hold a move-in yard sale to offer items to students. International and first-generation students would be invited first, then the sale would be open to all. Remaining items will be donated.
- Other ideas were suggested including:
 - an online option
 - EOP, Urban Scholars or other groups of students could be invited
 - Service Learning and the Backpack Program could be partners
- Volunteers will be needed, and more details will be forthcoming.
