About San Sebastian

Euskera (Basque) is a language whose origin is unknown, but is spoken by 35% of San Sebastián residents. It is one of the two official languages of Euskadi (the Basque Country). Donotia is Basque for San Sebastián. The other language in Euskadi is Castellano (Castilian Spanish). For this reason nearly all signs in the Basque Country are in both languages.

San Sebastian is quite a cosmopolitan city, bordering with France only 25 km away. San Sebastián has a French feel to it in the design of the streets and buildings of the city's Romantic district. If you walk through the Plaza de Gipuzcoa, or along Calle Prim with its surprising modernist houses, or the block made up of the Victoria Eugenia Theater and the María Cristina Hotel, you are taken back in time to the late nineteenth-century Paris.

The city center stretches along the La Concha Bay, a stunningly beautiful sight. During the warm spring and summer days this beach area is a favorite destination for locals and tourists who want to relax and enjoy the sun. It is said that San Sebastián has the nicest city beach anywhere in Spain. Overlooking the bay to each side, are two mountains, both of which provide excellent views of the city and the bay.

San Sebastián is an ideal destination for someone who wants to visit a part of Spain that is very different from the rest of the country. You will enjoy the friendly, intimate way of life this provincial capital offers, while still enjoying the wealth of cultural activities normally associated with the larger Spanish cities.

About the university

The University of Deusto is one of the most distinguished and prestigious academic institutions in Spain, with campuses both in Bilbao and San Sebastián. Its tradition of academic excellence in teaching and research has already gone beyond their borders due to the student exchange programs and credit transfer system.

The University of Deusto first opened in 1886. It was founded due to both the Basque Country's desire to have its own university and the Society of Jesus's wish to move its School of Higher Studies in La Guardia (Pontevedra) to a more central place.

Many changes have taken place at the University of Deusto since its foundation: the number of students has grown from five hundred in 1962 to over sixteen thousand nowadays. Other changes include: the number of lecturers has risen to more than six hundred, the number of faculties has increased by seven, and the creation of postgraduate degrees (master's degrees and diploma courses).

Transfer of Credits:

Grades do not transfer to Marquette University for this program. Only credits will transfer provided that a grade of "C" or higher is earned. For Universidad de Deusto, a score of 5 is equivalent to "C."
