Ulrich L. Lehner studied at the University of Munich and Notre Dame and received his Ph.D. from the University of Regensburg in 2005. After teaching two years at the University of Munich (2004–2006), he has been assistant professor of early modern religious history and historical theology at Marquette University since 2006. Dr. Lehner's research focuses on the history of Catholicism between 1648 and 1848 and he teaches both introductory and advanced courses on the history of theology.

Dr. Lehner was a fellow at the Institute for Comparative History of Religious Orders at the University of Eichstätt/Germany (2008) and a member of the Princeton Institute of Advanced Study (2009). In 2009, he was elected to the Catholic Academy, an honor's society for Catholic theologians whose membership is restricted to 75 members. He has written three books, the last of which, *Enlightened Monks*, is forthcoming next year, edited nine books and has published numerous articles and reviews.
