

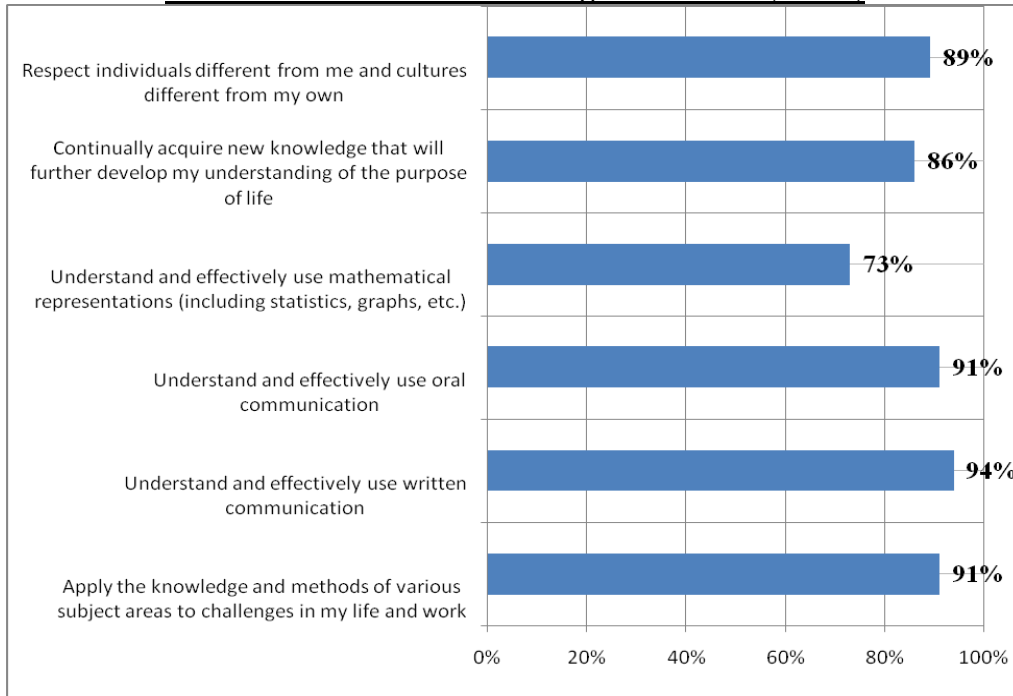
**OUTCOMES OF A MARQUETTE EDUCATION:
A Brief Summary of Assessment Outcome Data 2007**

Seniors at Time of Graduation

The annual Graduating Seniors Survey is conducted during spring semester’s Senior Week and serves as the primary source of information about Marquette’s graduating seniors. Seniors complete questions regarding learning during their undergraduate years as well as their plans for after graduation. The response rate for the 2007 survey was 53%, with 693 graduating seniors responding.

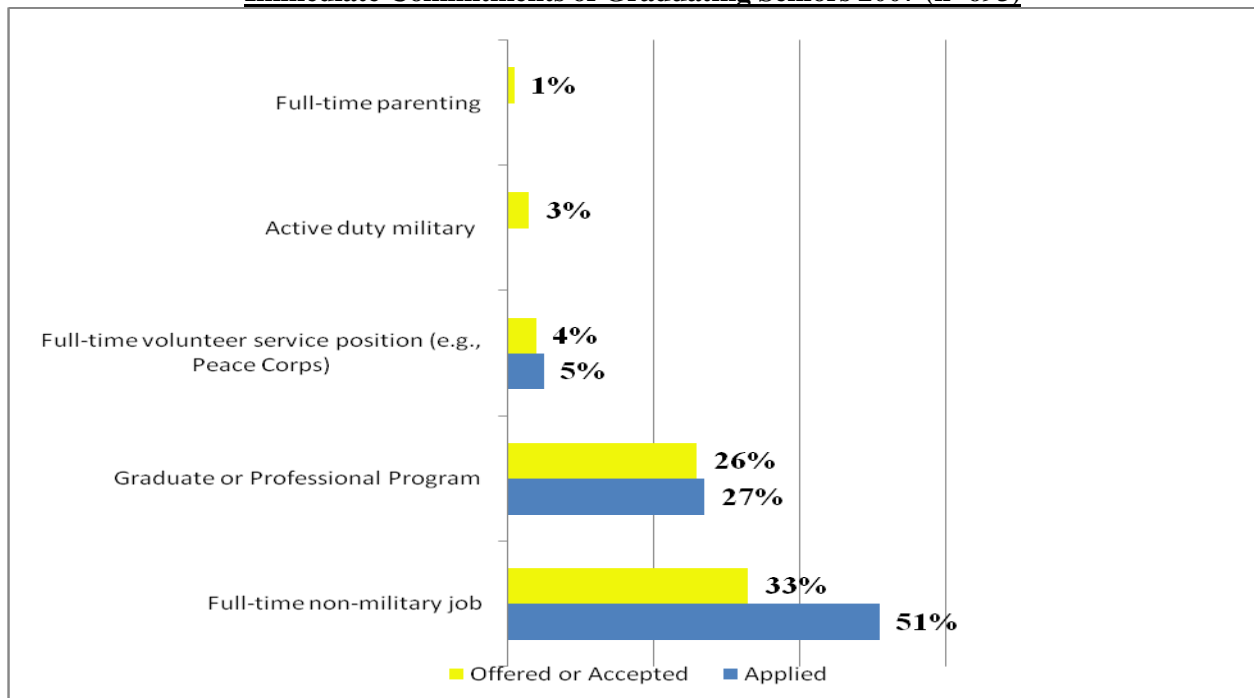
Abilities of Graduating Seniors. A significant percentage of graduating seniors reported confidence in their abilities to meet the six Marquette Common Core learning outcomes as a result of their Marquette education. Graduates were most confident (94% of students confident) of their ability to use effective written communication.

Immediate Commitments of Graduating Seniors. Over 65% reported commitments for full-time work or graduate/professional school.

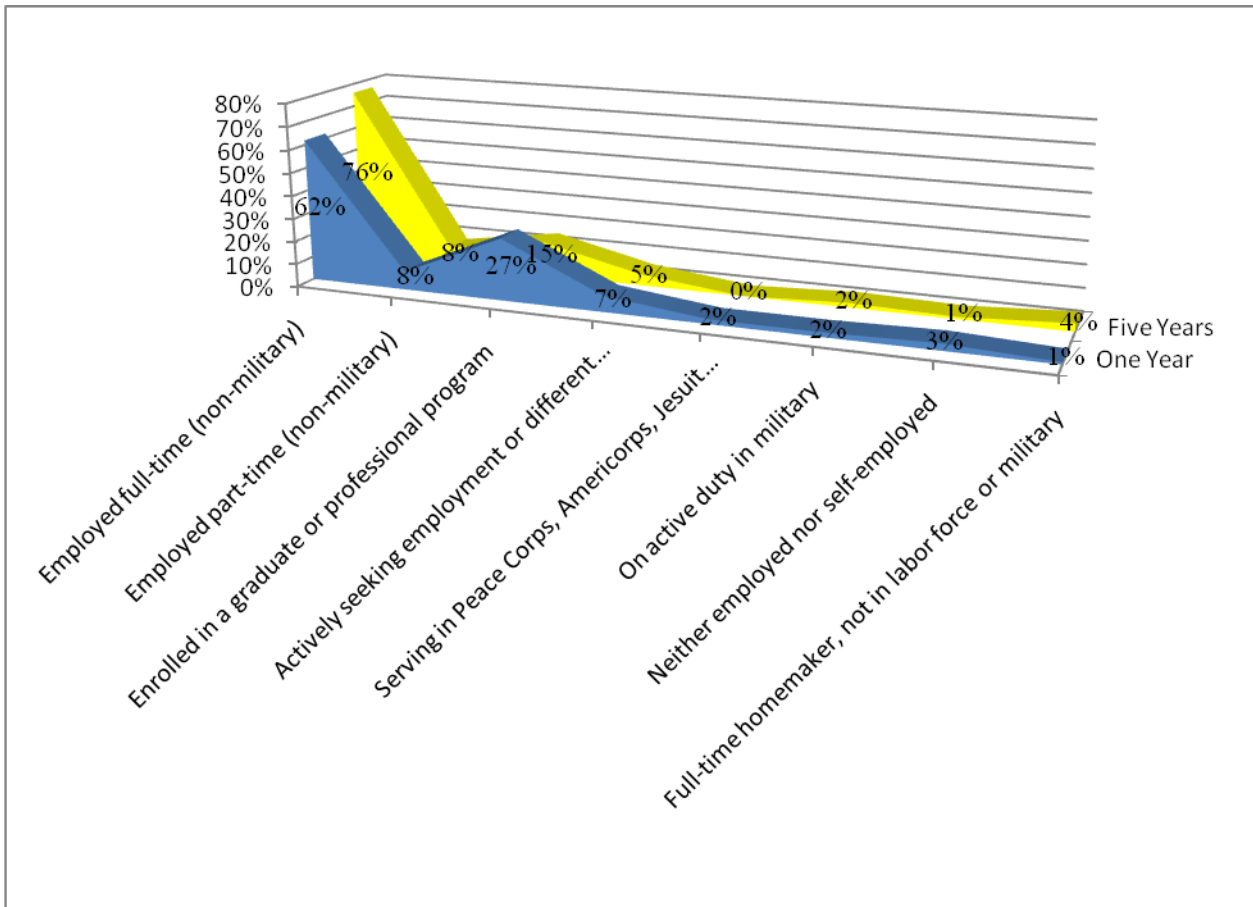
Immediate Commitments of Graduating Seniors 2007 (n=693)



Undergraduate Alumni One and Five Years Following Graduation

Undergraduate Alumni Surveys conducted in 2000, 2001, 2002, 2005, and 2006 asked alumni about general employment and advanced education outcomes. Five years following graduation over 78% of alumni report full-time employment and 34% say they completed a graduate or professional school program with an additional 15% currently enrolled in advanced education. At five years out only 1% report not being employed or self-employed at least part-time. (Note that these categories are not mutually exclusive; alumni could report falling into more than one category).
