

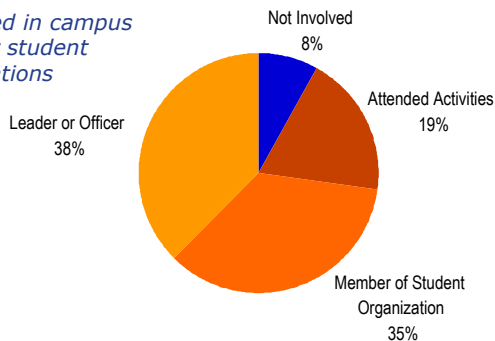
# 2006 Senior Survey Summary Report

This year's survey focuses on graduating seniors' engagement in co-curricular learning experiences while at Marquette as well as their plans for the immediate future. The Office of The Provost and The Division of Student Affairs administered this online survey in April of 2006. All of the graduating seniors were invited via email to complete the survey. 709 seniors responded to the survey, providing a response rate of 59%. This report was compiled by the Office of Student Development in August of 2006.

## Student Engagement as an Undergraduate

### Involvement in Campus Activities, Student Organizations and Leadership

92% participated in campus activities or student organizations



### Involvement in Faith Development Activities

- 46% indicated participating in University Ministry or faith development activities at least "once a year"
- 15% participated "once a week or more"
- 24% of non-Catholics and 53% of Catholics participated in faith development activities

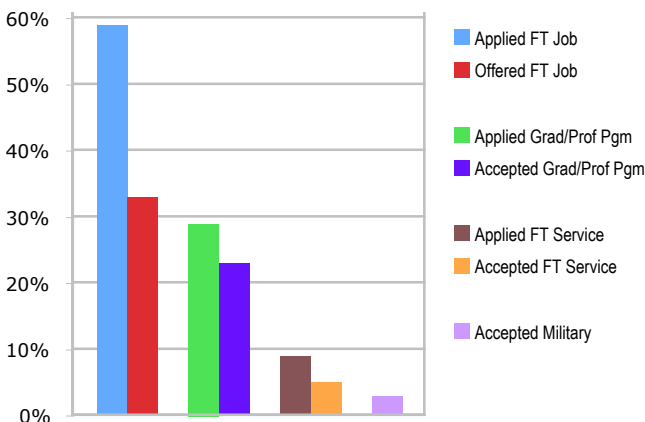
### Active Learning: Internships and Clinical Placements

- 47% completed an internship or clinical placement for which they received academic credit

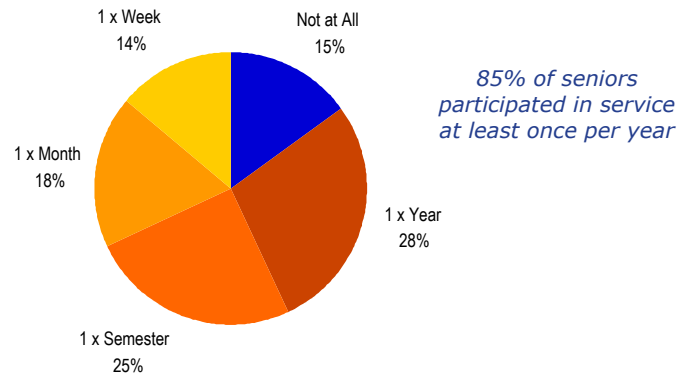
### International Experience

- 29% participated in an international experience
- 10% participated in 2 or more international experiences
- 23% studied abroad
- 11% participated in "other international experiences"
- 5% participated in volunteer programs (not service learning)
- 3% participated in Les Aspin Africa or international service learning

### Post-graduate Commitments at Time of Survey

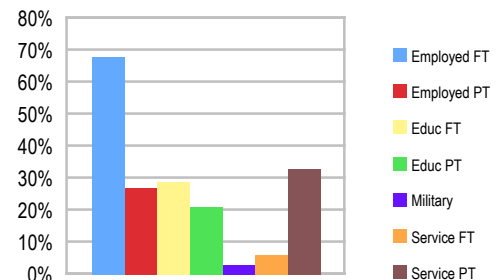


## Participation in Community Service and/or Service Learning during Undergraduate Years

## Comments on Marquette Experience

66% of respondents described their most positive experiences at Marquette, while 59% of respondents offered suggestions for improving the overall Marquette University experience. **The most frequent responses are listed in rank order.**

### Top Five Most Positive Experiences at Marquette

1. personal relationships
2. academics - quality of education, majors, programs
3. student organizations and activities
4. faculty - quality of and interactions/relationships with
5. community service and service learning

### Top Five Suggestions for Improving the Overall Marquette Experience

1. offer more to do on campus, better advertisement of things to do
2. enhance communication between administration and students
3. academics - increase program quality
3. residence halls/food/policies - e.g. make visitation policy less strict
4. campus environment and facilities - enhance classrooms, renovate some of the buildings, more study spaces
5. increase diversity
