A hybrid course is an alternative venue for students to pursue their education - whether that education is for an undergraduate or a graduate degree. "Hybrid" does not add work to any one course. All courses at the college level are difficult to different people for different reasons, interests, and goals. "Hybrid" is a term to describe a course that utilizes face-to-face learning, online group learning, online discussions and evaluations. It does not mean that in addition to the 8 or 16 class meetings that students will be expected to go online and/or meet in a group. The online component will be in place of the face-to-face learning. As an example, if a course is scheduled to run in an 8-week session, a student may have 4 or 5 face-to-face classes where the remaining 3 or 4 classes are online.
