"Hybrid" is a term to describe a course that utilizes face-to-face learning, online group learning, online discussions and evaluations. As an example, if a course is scheduled to run in an 8-week session, a student may have 4 or 5 face-to-face classes where the remaining 3 or 4 classes are online.
