Future Milwaukee participants examine issues, problems and dynamics confronting the greater Milwaukee area through in-depth interaction with key decision-makers, community explorations and collaborative group projects with a variety of civic, business and community organizations. Administered since 2006 by the College of Professional Studies of Marquette University, the Future Milwaukee Leadership Program demonstrates life-long learning through core values of Civic Engagement, Ethical Leadership and Social Responsibility, experiential exploration and applied inquiry utilizing “the Milwaukee community as our classroom.”*

- 1.
