The Career Alumni Network is part of the Marquette Alumni Association's database, MU Connect. Alumni who register on the database can choose to become a volunteer for the Career Alumni Network. They can then help students who contact them by offering advice, information and support as students research career fields, seek internships or search for full-time positions in a particular profession, city or organization.

Students can then choose the professional area in which they would like to find a Marquette volunteer alum. Information is given about the alum's degree, date of graduation and job title. Sometime the alum will write a career history so that students can see their progression to a certain field or level.

Click on the alum's name and an e-mail box appears so that students can communicate directly with the alum, asking them for advice on how to enter a particular field. Students can attach their resume so that the alum can see the student's qualifications but the resume is not given as a job search tool at the alum's company unless the alum asks to distribute it for that purpose.

- Select a manageable number of alumni volunteers to contact. Following up with more than three might prove time consuming. You can always visit this site again to select more alumni volunteers later.
- Be sure to include your full name, major, year and any other information relevant to your request. You may choose to include your phone number if a conversation would be appropriate and amenable to you both.
- Do not feel that you are imposing, as these alumni volunteers have given their permission for students and alumni to contact them.
