- What are the ramifications of trauma to the dentition for long term retention?
- How can the tooth with immature apical development be best managed?
- Is vital pulp therapy a viable option vs. root canal treatment?
- Is it pulpal problem or periodontal problem or both?
- What can be done when teeth have a fractured or caries margins below the soft tissue or bone?
- Treatment planning challenges in a wide variety of circumstances--which is best?
- How can treatment outcomes be best assessed?
- Revision of previous treatment-- when, why, how and what is best?
- What new techniques or materials can assist me in treatment planning tooth retention?

- Describe new material and/or techniques that may impact on the decision for tooth retention.
