

## *1950s and 60s*

**Terence T. Evans** (BA) received his law degree from Marquette University. In 1979 Evans was nominated by President Jimmy Carter to be a Judge on the United States District Court for the Eastern District of Wisconsin. Judge Evans served as Chief Judge of the Eastern District from 1991 until his successful nomination to the United States Court of Appeals for the Seventh Circuit by President Bill Clinton in 1995.

**William Evans** (BA), after a 30 year career in international business, is now on his second career as Head of Marketing for a French-American private business college (MBA Institute) in Paris, France.

**Jean Fleet** (BA) is a long-time instructor in the Milwaukee Public Schools, most recently at Riverside University High School. She was named the Wisconsin Global Educator of the Year for 2005-2006 and received the Teacher-Scholar Award from the National Endowment for the Humanities. She has traveled on Fulbrights to Eastern Europe and to India. She also served on the core committee to write the National Standards in World History.

**James Frey** (BA), president of Educational Credential Evaluators, Inc. in Milwaukee, received the Excellence in International Education award from the American Association of Collegiate Registrars and Admissions Officers (AACRAO) at the AACRAO conference in San Diego in April 2006. Jim was the first recipient of this new award.

**Joseph P. Heim** (BA) received his PhD in political science from the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee and has for many years been a professor of political science at the University of Wisconsin-LaCrosse. He frequently conducts public opinion surveys and works as a commentator on local politics.

**Richard Hryniewicki** (BA, MA) taught for many years in Milwaukee area public schools. In 1998 he was named one of four "Teachers of the Year" by the Department of Public Instruction. Now retired, he works as a volunteer photographer at the Milwaukee County Historical Society.

**Dr. James Mellonig** (BA) received his Doctor of Dentistry degree from Marquette University Dental School. He is presently professor of dentistry and director of the Advanced Education Program in Periodontics at The University of Texas Health Science Center at San Antonio. He received the 2003 Outstanding Educator Award from the American Academy of Periodontology.

**Alberto Meloni** (BA, MA) received an MA in American history from Harvard University and did PhD work at the University of Minnesota before beginning a twenty-five year career as a museum administrator. He became president of Exploration Place in Kansas City in 2006. His work as CEO of St. Joseph Museum, Inc., earned him the Governor's Humanities Award in 2003.

**Dr. George David Metrey** (BA) received his M. S. W. in psychiatry from Fordham University and his doctorate in public administration at New York University. He is dean of the pre-medical program at Xavier Medical School in Aruba.

**Charles C. Mulcahy** (BA) has practiced law in Milwaukee for several decades. He has served on numerous boards, including the Medical College of Wisconsin, and is currently a senior advisor to the McKinley Reserve, a Wisconsin-based worldwide investment firm.

**Frederick A. Muth, Jr.** (BA) received his law degree from Marquette University law school and for many years practiced law in Milwaukee. He was chairman of Whyte Hirschboeck Dudek for nearly twenty years and has served on the boards of many charitable, educational, and religious organizations in the area, including the Board of Trustees of Alverno College and the President's Council, of Marquette University. He was Law Alumnus of the Year, Marquette University Law School, in 1979.

**Michael S. Nolan** (BA) earned his law degree from Marquette University, where he edited the law review, and was a Fulbright scholar at the University of Manchester in England. **John F. Tefft** (BA) is the United States Ambassador to the Republic of Georgia. He has been a career Foreign Service Officer for thirty-five years. Before assuming his current position, Tefft served as the Deputy Assistant Secretary of State for European and Eurasian Affairs and was responsible for US relations with Russia, Ukraine, Belarus and Moldova. From 2003-2004 Tefft was the International Affairs Advisor at the National War College in Washington, D.C. Tefft served as the United States Ambassador to Lithuania from 2000 to 2003. He was Deputy Chief of Mission at the US Embassy in Moscow from 1996 to 1999, and was Charge d'Affaires from

November 1996 to September 1997. His other Foreign Service assignments include Jerusalem, Budapest and Rome.

**George W. Thomas** (BA) received his law degree from The Ohio State University. He has been a lawyer in the construction industry for many years, and is currently Market Development Manager for Construction Claims Services for PinnacleOne, a consulting firm in Maryland.

**Rev. Thomas Eugene Unz** (BA) is pastor of Divine Providence Parish in Westchester, Illinois.

**Dr. Herman J. Viola** (BA, MA) went on to receive his PhD from Indiana University. He is a curator emeritus at the Smithsonian's National Museum of Natural History, where he served as director of the Museum's National Anthropological Archives in addition to organizing two major exhibitions for the Smithsonian. "Magnificent Voyagers" told the story of the United State Exploring Expedition of 1838-42, and "Seeds of Change" examined the exchange of plants, animals, and diseases between the Old and the New Worlds. Prior to joining the staff of the Smithsonian Institution in 1972, he was an archivist at the National Archives of the United States, where he launched and was first editor of *Prologue: The Journal of the National Archives*. She is Chancellor Professor of Anthropology, College of William and Mary, and a research associate in the Near East Section of the University of Pennsylvania Museum.
