

Apply For Admission

A complete application consists of:

1. Application — it's free at Marquette.edu/explore
2. Official final high school transcripts
3. Official college transcripts — mailed directly from your current/previous institution(s) to Marquette. If you have attended multiple institutions, an official transcript is required from each school.
4. ACT and/or SAT scores are required only if you have completed fewer than 12 credits of college-level work

Please have all credentials mailed to the address found at the bottom of the sheet.

Nursing transfer applicants

Transfer applications to the College of Nursing BSN degree programs are no longer being accepted or reviewed. The traditional BSN program has reached capacity enrollment with Marquette students and transfer applications to this program are no longer considered. The RN-to-BSN degree completion program, for those already holding an Associate's Degree in Nursing/RN license, has been phased out.

All other transfer applicants

Marquette mails admission decisions with official credit evaluations on a rolling basis, usually within four weeks of application completion.

January 2012 (spring) applicants: Application review begins in early September and continues on a rolling basis until classes are full. Priority consideration will be given to completed applications postmarked by Dec. 1, 2011.

August 2012 (fall) applicants: Application review begins in January so we can include fall course work in the review process. Application review continues on a rolling basis until classes are full. Priority consideration will be given to completed applications postmarked by June 1, 2012. Applications postmarked after this date will be reviewed on a space available basis.

Apply For Financial Aid

More than 90 percent of Marquette's students receive some form of financial aid (scholarships, grants, loans and employment). To receive maximum consideration for need-based aid, complete the following steps:

1. Apply for admission
2. File the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) for the academic year in which you plan to enroll at Marquette. You need not wait until you have been admitted to complete it. Complete the FAFSA online at www.fafsa.ed.gov. If you have received a renewal FAFSA, be sure to list Marquette (code 003863) as one of the schools to receive your information.

Apply For Scholarships

Ignatius Scholarships. Transfers from four-year and two-year colleges are eligible to be considered for these scholarships, which are based upon academics, essay, service and leadership. You will be considered for this scholarship program simply by completing your admission application. Be sure to provide a thorough list of extracurricular activities. There is no deadline for this scholarship program.

Phi Theta Kappa Scholarships. Transfers from two-year colleges who are members of PTK Honor Society may apply.*

Transfer Scholarships. Transfers from two-year colleges may apply for these scholarships. Serious consideration is given to those applicants who have completed at least 24 semester hours (or the equivalent), earning at least a 3.2 cumulative grade point average (on a 4.0 scale) prior to Marquette entry.*

Dean's Scholarships. Transfers from designated Illinois and Wisconsin two-year colleges may apply.*

While there are no deadlines for these programs, priority consideration for these scholarship programs begins October 15 for January applicants, or March 15 for August applicants, and continues until funds are exhausted.
