

The Market Basket Program

Connecting the Marquette Community to Healthy, Local Food Supplies

What is the Market Basket Program?

Every Friday, Growing Power, a local urban agricultural center, delivers Market Baskets to businesses and communities in Milwaukee and Chicago. The baskets contain an assortment of fruits and vegetables at a reduced cost. In the winter, the produce is purchased from national suppliers, but the produce is purchased from local, Wisconsin farmers during the spring and summer months.

Students for an Environmentally Active Campus (SEAC) connects the Marquette community to these local farmers with the Market Basket Program. Students, faculty, and residents from the surrounding neighborhoods can order the following items:

Senior Basket	\$8 (feeds 1-2 people for a week)
Regular Basket	\$14 (feeds 2-4 people for a week)
All-fruit Basket	\$14 (feeds 2-4 people for a week)
Organic Basket	\$26 (feeds 2-4 people for a week)

The contents of the baskets vary from week to week, as produce becomes available.

How To Order?

If you would like to order a basket, email your order to marketbaskets@gmail.com by noon on Tuesdays. Pick-up will be between 2:30-5:00 p.m. on Fridays (of the same week you placed your order), outside of the Office of Student Development on the first floor of the AMU. Payment (cash or check) is due when you pick up your basket.
