IT'S GOOD TO HAVE SO MANY LOCAL AND STATE OFFICIALS HERE FOR THIS EVENT. IT'S A TESTAMENT TO THE IMPORTANCE OF THIS PLANT AND THE IMPACT IT WILL HAVE ON THE COMMUNITY.

THANK YOU, DUANE HALVERSON (Land O' Lakes chief operating officer) AND EVERYONE AT LAND O' LAKES FOR INVITING ME.

IT IS TRULY A PLEASURE BEING HERE TO BREAK GROUND ON THIS NEW BUILDING, WHICH WILL BE STATE-OF-THE-ART AND THE ONLY ONE OF ITS KIND IN THE STATE.

I WOULD LIKE TO THANK LAND O' LAKES FOR CHOOSING BLACK RIVER FALLS FOR THIS BUILDING.

I DON'T MEAN TO SOUND BIASED, BUT YOU'VE MADE A WISE CHOICE SELECTING WISCONSIN OVER OUR GOOD NEIGHBORS, IOWA AND MINNESOTA.

YOU CAN COUNT ON THE CONTINUED SUPPORT OF THE COMMUNITY AND THE STATE. WE ARE WORKING ON A CUSTOMIZED LABOR TRAINING GRANT, PLUS WE HAVE A TRANSPORTATION GRANT THAT WE WILL PRESENT LATER. WE ARE HONORED TO DO OUR PART TO MAKE THIS PROJECT SUCCEED.

BUT THE MOST IMPORTANT INGREDIENT IS THE GREAT PEOPLE HERE IN JACKSON COUNTY. THE FOLKS IN BLACK RIVER FALLS AND SURROUNDING AREAS ARE DEDICATED, HARD-WORKING PEOPLE.

WE'RE THRILLED THAT LAND O' LAKES IS ABLE TO BRING THESE GOOD JOBS TO THE COMMUNITY.
LAND O' LAKES AND BLACK RIVER FALLS ARE A GREAT MATCH.

LAND O'LAKES HAS LONG BEEN A LEADER IN THE DAIRY INDUSTRY, SO IT'S ONLY NATURAL THAT YOUR COMPANY CONTINUES TO BUILD ITS PARTNERSHIP WITH AMERICA'S DAIRYLAND.

WE HAVE WORKED HARD HERE IN WISCONSIN TO EARN AND KEEP THE TITLE OF AMERICA'S DAIRYLAND. FARMERS AND AGRICULTURE PLAY A CENTRAL ROLE IN OUR LIVES, CONTRIBUTING MORE THAN 17 BILLION DOLLARS TO THE STATE ECONOMY.

WE'RE THE NATION'S NUMBER ONE CHEESE PRODUCING STATE. WE ARE IN THE MIDST OF A FIVE-YEAR TREND THAT WILL SEE MILK PRODUCTION INCREASE IN WISCONSIN BY 15 PERCENT.

WE'RE LOOKING FORWARD TO THE DAY NEXT YEAR WHEN THIS PLANT IS FINALLY OPEN.

AS I SAID BEFORE, IT WILL BE A STATE-OF-THE-ART BUILDING. IT'S ALSO THE FIRST TOTALLY NEW ANIMAL MILK REPLACER PLANT BUILT IN THIS STATE IN ABOUT 20 YEARS.

THIS PLANT IS ANOTHER EXAMPLE OF LAND O'LAKES CONTINUED SUPPORT OF OUR DAIRY FARMERS, PRODUCING FORMULA FOR DAIRY CALVES AND OTHER ANIMALS.

AND IT'S BEING DONE IN A HIGH-TECH FASHION, AND THAT'S WHAT WILL SET THIS PLANT APART. THIS IS GOING TO BE A WORLD-CLASS PLANT, AND I MEAN THAT LITERALLY. LAND O' LAKE'S MILK REPLACER BUSINESS IS NATIONAL AND INTERNATIONAL IN ITS SCOPE. THIS PLANT WILL ONLY SERVE TO IMPROVE THAT STANDING.

YOU KNOW I'M A BIG SUPPORTER OF HIGH-TECH BUSINESS IN WISCONSIN. IT'S THE SORT OF BUSINESS THAT WILL KEEP OUR ECONOMY GOING STRONG IN THE 21ST CENTURY.

MUCH OF THE TECHNOLOGY FOR THIS BUILDING IS PATENT-PENDING BY LAND O' LAKES ... JUST FOR THIS PLANT.

THERE WILL BE ABOUT 20 TO 30 JOBS TO BEGIN WITH, AND THIS PLANT WILL BE FULLY EXPANDABLE FOR THE FUTURE.

WITH THIS PLANT, LAND O' LAKES IS DOING SOME GREAT THINGS FOR WISCONSIN'S DAIRY INDUSTRY. SO WE ARE PLEASED TODAY TO DO A LITTLE SOMETHING IN RETURN.

THE STATE OF WISCONSIN IS IN THE PROCESS OF DEVELOPING A \$100,000 CUSTOMIZED LABOR-TRAINING GRANT FOR LAND O' LAKES. A HIGH-TECH FACILITY LIKE THIS WILL CERTAINLY REQUIRE SPECIAL TRAINING. WE ARE TRULY DEDICATED TO HELPING LAND O' LAKES PREPARE ITS WORKFORCE.

I WOULD ALSO LIKE TO TAKE THIS TIME TO PRESENT A TRANSPORTATION ECONOMIC ASSISTANCE GRANT TO THE COMMUNITY OF BLACK RIVER FALLS.

OUR TEA GRANT PROGRAM HELPS COMMUNITIES LIKE BLACK RIVER FALLS CREATE OR KEEP JOBS IN THE AREA. THIS \$47,500 GRANT WILL HELP PAY HALF THE COST FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF A 300-FOOT RAIL SPUR THAT WILL CONNECT WITH A UNION PACIFIC RAIL LINE.

THIS RAIL SPUR WILL HELP LAND O' LAKES
OPERATE ITS NEW PLANT MORE EFFICIENTLY AND
GET ITS PRODUCT TO ALL ITS CUSTOMERS. WE
ARE PLEASED TO HELP MAKE THIS POSSIBLE.
