GOOD MORNING. I'M DELIGHTED TO BE HERE TO MAKE A SPECIAL ANNOUCEMENT. AND I'VE ENLISTED THE HELP OF SOME OF PAYNE AND DOLAN'S WORKERS TO HELP ME OUT.

(-- point to group of construction workers -- who will hold up signs proclaiming "We're done early!")

ISN'T THAT GREAT NEWS, LADIES AND GENTLEMEN! TODAY WE'RE ANNOUNCING THAT AS OF THIS SATURDAY, REPAIRS ON THE EAST-WEST CORRIDOR WILL BE COMPLETE AND ALL LANES OF TRAFFIC WILL BE OPEN TO TRAFFIC BY THE END OF THE DAY.

THERE WILL BE OCCASIONAL NIGHTTIME CLOSURES FOR SPOT WORK, BUT MOST MOTORISTS WON'T EVEN BE AWARE IT'S GOING ON.

THIS REALLY IS GREAT NEWS...TO TRUCKERS, TOURISTS, BUSINESSMEN AND WOMEN, COMMUTERS, UP TO 175,000 DRIVERS WHO USE THE I-94 EAST-WEST CORRIDOR EVERY DAY. THIS FREEWAY IS NOW IN THE BEST SHAPE IT'S BEEN IN SINCE WISCONSIN'S FIRST FREEWAY SEGMENT WAS OPENED IN WAUKESHA COUNTY IN 1958 – DURING THE TERM OF ANOTHER REPUBLICAN GOVERNOR...VERNON THOMPSON.

OVER THE NEXT EIGHT YEARS MUCH OF THE REST OF THE FREEWAY IN SOUTHEASTERN WISCONSIN WAS OPENED, WITH THE MARQUETTE INTERCHANGE FINALLY OPENING IN AUGUST, 1966, DURING WARREN KNOWLES' TERM.

EVERYTHING CONSIDERED, THIS REPAIR PROJECT HAS BEEN AN OVERWHELMING SUCCESS...IN TERMS OF SAFETY...QUALITY WORK...MEETING OR EXCEEDING DEADLINES...AND IN MAKING SURE THAT THE GREATER MILWAUKEE COMMUNITY WAS KEPT OPEN AND MOBILE, WITH THE ECONOMY THRIVING.

LAST YEAR'S WESTBOUND RESURFACING FINISHED ONE MONTH AHEAD OF SCHEDULE...IN TIME, YOU MIGHT REMEMBER, FOR THE STATE FAIR.

THIS YEAR, WE BEAT THE DEADLINES AGAIN, WITH DAYTIME WORK COMPLETED BY JUNE 8TH OVER ABOUT TWO-THIRDS OF THE EASTBOUND PROJECT.

NOW, WE'RE HERE TO CELEBRATE COMPLETION OF THE ENTIRE PROJECT...ON TIME AND ON BUDGET, TWO WEEKS AHEAD OF SCHEDULE.

THERE'S MORE GOOD NEWS. WE'RE ALSO GOING TO COMPLETE THE NORTH-SOUTH STADIUM FREEWAY PROJECT AHEAD OF SCHEDULE.

WE HAD TO RECONSTRUCT AND REALIGN THE STADIUM FREEWAY TO MAKE WAY FOR MILLER PARK. INITIALLY, WE SAID THE STADIUM FREEWAY WOULD BE CLOSED FOR TWO FULL CONSTRUCTION SEASONS, MEANING UNTIL NOVEMBER OF THIS YEAR.

I'M HAPPY TO TELL YOU THAT THE NORTH-SOUTH FREEWAY IS SCHEDULED TO BE OPEN TO TRAFFIC BY AROUND AUGUST 3...ABOUT THREE MONTHS AHEAD OF SCHEDULE.

WE'RE DELIVERING THE NORTH-SOUTH STADIUM FREEWAY PROJECT ON TIME AND UNDER BUDGET. AND IN THE PROCESS, WE'VE KEPT OUR COMMITMENT TO MINORITY CONTRACTOR INVOLVEMENT...25% IN ENGINEERING AND CONSTRUCTION.

THERE ARE MANY, MANY PEOPLE WHO CAN RIGHTFULLY SHARE CREDIT FOR THESE SUCCESSFUL PROJECTS. IT TOOK A LOT OF HARD EFFORT...THE KIND OF WORK ETHIC FOR WHICH WISCONSIN IS FAMOUS...AND A LOT OF COOPERATION AND PARTNERING WITH LOCAL COMMUNITIES AND THE PRIVATE SECTOR.

I ESPECIALLY WANT TO THANK THE PRIME CONTRACTORS...PAYNE AND DOLAN AND ZENITH TECH, ALONG WITH THE MANY SUBCONTRACTORS AND HUNDREDS OF WORKERS, FOR THEIR WORK ON THE EAST-WEST. THE CONSTRUCTION WORKERS PUT IN LONG, HARD HOURS, OFTEN 12 HOURS A DAY, SIX OR SEVEN DAYS A WEEK, INCLUDING EASTER SUNDAY AND MOTHERS' DAY.

THESE WORKERS PUT THEIR LIVES ON THE LINE EACH TIME THEY REPORTED FOR THEIR WORK SHIFTS. WE HAD ONE HORRIBLE TRAGEDY...AND LET'S PAUSE BRIEFLY TO REMEMBER PETER MESSERLIE (Messer-lee), THE YOUNG CONSTRUCTION WORKER KILLED BY AN IMPAIRED DRIVER WHO WAS TRAVELING IN A RESTRICTED LANE.

(Pause)

CERTAINLY, ONE FATALITY IS ONE TOO MANY. BUT IF WE CAN LOOK BEYOND THIS TRAGEDY, THE WORKERS AND THE MOTORING PUBLIC HAD AN OUTSTANDING SAFETY RECORD. CONSTRUCTION WORKERS OFTEN ARE ONLY A FOOT OR LESS REMOVED FROM LIVE TRAFFIC, TRAVELING AT 50 OR 55 MILES PER HOUR IN THE ADJACENT LANE, SEPARATED ONLY BY A FEW ORANGE BARRELS.

THOSE WHO USE THIS SECTION OF FREEWAY DESERVE SPECIAL THANKS...FOR BEING SAFETY CONSCIOUS, FOR OBSERVING SPEED LIMITS, AND FOR AN IMPRESSIVE SHOW OF CIVIC COOPERATION BY WILLINGNESS TO PUT UP WITH PERSONAL SACRIFICE AND INCONVENIENCE.

THOUSANDS OF FREEWAY USERS MADE THIS PROJECT WORK BY USING TRANSPORTATION ALTERNATIVES. PEOPLE RODE THE BUS IN IMPRESSIVE NUMBERS, TAKING ADVANTAGE OF UP TO UP TO 190 HOURS OF STATE SUBSIDIZED EXTRA BUS SERVICE EACH DAY.

WISCONSIN COACH LINES REPORTS RIDERSHIP UP AS MUCH AS 40%. FIVE HUNDRED ADDITIONAL RIDERS ON SELECTED MILWAUKEE COUNTY TRANSIT SYSTEM ROUTES. WAUKESHA METRO TRANSIT, UP MORE THAN 5% ON ITS ROUTE TO BROOKFIELD SQUARE. THOUSANDS OF OTHERS USED THE AMTRAK HIAWATHA EXTENSION, SET UP SPECIFICALLY AS AN ALTERNATIVE TO FREEWAY DRIVING THIS YEAR. MANY OTHER PEOPLE USED ALTERNATE ROUTES – TELECOMMUTED – CARPOOLED – OR LEFT EARLIER FOR THEIR DESTINATIONS.

WHAT A MAGNIFICENT SHOW OF PUBLIC SPIRIT BY OUR CITIZENS. MORE THAN 40% OF DAILY COMMUTERS GOT OFF THE FREEWAY. AND WITH VERY FEW EXCEPTIONS, CONGESTION ON SURFACE STREETS HAS BEEN ENDURABLE.

WE'VE ALSO KEPT MILWAUKEE MOBILE, AND THE ECONOMY HUMMING, DESPITE CONSTRUCTION. BUSINESS PEOPLE FROM DOWNTOWN TO THE SUBURBS TELL US THAT ROAD CONSTRUCTION HASN'T IMPAIRED COMMERCE, INDUSTRY, TRUCKING OR TOURISM.

MILWAUKEE BREWERS' ATTENDANCE: UP SUBSTANTIALLY BOTH THIS YEAR AND LAST YEAR.

SUMMERFEST SET AN ALL-TIME ATTENDANCE RECORD LAST YEAR, AND RECENTLY FINISHED ANOTHER OUTSTANDING RUN.

THE HARLEY REUNION WAS A MAGNIFICENT SUCCESS...WITH MORE THAN 125,000 VISITORS LAST MONTH PUMPING AN ADDITIONAL \$120 MILLION INTO THE AREA ECONOMY.

AND COMING UP, WE EXPECT ANOTHER HIGHLY SUCCESSFUL STATE FAIR AND A VISIT FROM GOVERNORS ACROSS THE COUNTRY FOR THE NATIONAL GOVERNOR'S ASSOCIATION CONFERENCE.

BECAUSE OF CAREFUL PLANNING, THE ECONOMY CONTINUED TO THRIVE, THE COMMUNITY STAYED OPEN AND MOBILE, AND THE PROJECT STILL FINISHED AHEAD OF SCHEDULE.

WE USED INNOVATION ON THIS PROJECT...LIKE A NEW, HIGH-TECH ASPHALT, CALLED "SUPERPAVE," DESIGNED TO KEEP THIS MORE THAN 35-YEAR-OLD FREEWAY TOGETHER FOR ANOTHER 10 YEARS.

BUT EVENTUALLY, WE KNOW THAT THE ENTIRE FREEWAY SYSTEM WILL HAVE TO BE REBUILT. THE MILWAUKEE AREA HAS A LOT OF TRANSPORTATION NEEDS...AND WE KNOW THAT A SOUND TRANSPORTATION SYSTEM IS VITAL TO ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AND JOB CREATION.

IN FACT, OVER THE LAST FOUR FISCAL YEARS, THE STATE HAS SPENT \$227.4 MILLION FOR HIGHWAY CONSTRUCTION IN MILWAUKEE COUNTY ON THE STATE AND LOCAL HIGHWAY SYSTEMS. IN WAUKESHA COUNTY, THE CORRESPONDING FIGURE WE'VE SPENT IS \$89.6 MILLION.

THESE INVESTMENTS SHOW OUR COMMITMENT TO MILWAUKEE AND ALL OF SOUTHEASTERN WISCONSIN.

NEXT YEAR, MAJOR IMPROVEMENTS ARE SCHEDULED AGAIN...WITH RESURFACING OF I-94 FROM THE MITCHELL INTERCHANGE TO THE RACINE COUNTY LINE...PLUS MAJOR BRIDGE IMPROVEMENTS IN THE HALE INTERCHANGE. AFTER THAT WILL COME IMPROVEMENTS TO US 45...AND SHORTLY AFTER THE YEAR 2000, WE'LL HAVE TO REBUILD THE MARQUETTE INTERCHANGE.

THESE BIG PROJECTS WILL BE BIG CHALLENGES ...JUST LIKE THE I-94 RESURFACING. BUT WE HAVE PROVEN THAT WE'RE UP TO HANDLING BIG CHALLENGES.
