- MAYOR CRAWFORD, MAYOR HONDA (HUNDA), HONORED GUESTS, LADIES AND GENTLEMEN. GOOD AFTERNOON.
- WHAT A GREAT DAY TO BE HERE TO OFFICIALLY DEDICATE YOUR BRAND NEW, ALMOST \$15 MILLION WATERFRONT PROJECT.

- WITH THE NEW 8TH STREET AND THE NEW 8TH STREET BRIDGE ... THE MANITOWOC BUSINESS DISTRICT AND LAKEFRONT/BUSINESS DISTRICT IS WHOLE AGAIN.
- I WAS HERE IN JANUARY, 1994, FOR THE CLOSING CEREMONY OF THE OLD STRUCTURE...WE HAVE MADE REAL PROGRESS SINCE THEN.

• I WOULD LIKE TO THANK TO TRANSPORTATION DISTRICT OFFICE IN GREEN BAY, LES FAFARD AND HIS CREW... AND ONE OF THE BEST CONTRACTORS IN THE BUSINESS, ZENITH TECH OF WAUKESHA ... AND MANY SUBCONTRACTORS ... WHO WORKED TOGETHER TO MAKE THIS PROJECT POSSIBLE.

- IT HAS BEEN A MONUMENTAL CHALLENGE ... BUT WE MET THE CHALLENGES AND BUILT A NEW BRIDGE IN ONLY TWO CONSTRUCTION SEASONS.

## IMPACTS OF BUDGET DELAY

- "SO WHAT IF WE DON'T PASS A BUDGET OR INCREASE TRANSPORTATION FUNDING?" THE "SO WHAT" IMPACT WILL BE REAL AND IMMEDIATE FOR YEARS TO COME.
- FOR STARTERS ... OUR HIGHWAY CONSTRUCTION PROGRAM WILL BE IN REAL TROUBLE.
- WE HAVE LESS THAN \$3 MILLION LEFT IN THE PROGRAM ... THAT WOULD PAY FOR LESS THAN 3 MILES OF HIGHWAYS ... IN RURAL AREAS ... IF NO PROBLEMS CAME UP.
- THAT MEANS WE CAN'T WORK ON HIGHWAYS 10, 29, 41, 51 AND 76
  NEXT YEAR IF WE DON'T GET A BUDGET BY THE END OF THE MONTH.
- HAVE TO DELAY REPAIRS ON 20 OTHER STATE HIGHWAYS IN 16 COUNTIES, BECAUSE THERE WON'T BE ENOUGH TIME OR MONEY TO GET THEM FINISHED BY THE END OF 1996.
- THE LONGER WE WAIT TO FIX OUR HIGHWAYS, THE BIGGER OUR PROBLEMS BECOME.
- IT COSTS \$1.5 MILLION PER MILE TO BUILD AND FIX A HIGHWAY THE RIGHT WAY ... BUT IT COSTS \$2.4 MILLION TO BUILD AND FIX THE SAME HIGHWAY IF YOU PUT OFF REPAIRS TO SAVE MONEY ... THAT'S A 50% DIFFERENCE.
- IF WE KEEP PUTTING OFF HIGHWAY REPAIR NEEDS YEAR AFTER YEAR. THERE'S A RIPPLE EFFECT THAT SENDS COSTS SOARING.
- A 20% CUT IN HIGHWAY REPAIR FUNDING THIS YEAR WOULD LEAVE \$40 MILLION OF WORK UNDONE. THAT GROWS TO \$80 MILLION BY 1999 AND \$240 MILLION IN CATCH-UP WORK BY 2003.
