GOOD MORNING, EVERYONE. AND HAPPY NEW YEAR.

I HAVE A VERY GOOD FEELING THAT 1993 IS GOING TO BE A GREAT YEAR FOR ALL OF US HERE IN WISCONSIN. ONE JUST HAS TO LOOK BACK AT OUR MANY SUCCESSES IN 1992 TO HAVE AN OPTIMISTIC VIEW FOR THE NEW YEAR.

ONE AREA OF SUCCESS BRINGS US HERE TODAY.

LADIES AND GENTLEMEN, I AM PLEASED TO ANNOUNCE THAT IN 1992, WISCONSIN RECORDED ITS LOWEST FATALITY RATE IN ITS HISTORY.

THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION ESTIMATES THAT OUR FATALITY RATE PER 100 MILLION MILES OF TRAVEL WAS 1.36 ... SUBSTANTIALLY BELOW THE NEXT LOWEST RATE, IN 1990 AND ONE OF THE LOWEST RATES IN THE COUNTRY.

IT ALSO MARKS THE MOST DRAMATIC ONE-YEAR PERCENTAGE REDUCTION IN THE NATION.

OUR FATALITY COUNT OF 643 IS 19 PERCENT BELOW LAST YEAR'S YEAR-END TOTAL.

THERE IN NO DOUBT THAT WISCONSIN HAS CONSISTENTLY IMPROVED ITS TRAFFIC SAFETY SINCE THE DAWN OF OUR FIRST STATE HIGHWAY COMMISSION, 80 YEARS AGO.

SEVERAL FACTORS LEAD TO OUR SUCCESSFUL YEAR:

OUR ROADWAYS AND VEHICLES ARE BEING BUILT WITH SAFETY AS A TOP PRIORITY.

BECAUSE OF PUBLIC INFORMATION CAMPAIGNS AND TOUGH LAWS,

PARTNERSHIPS BETWEEN LAW ENFORCEMENT AND ENGINEERS, BETWEEN FEDERAL STATE AND LOCAL OFFICIALS AND BETWEEN GOVERNMENT AND THE PRIVATE SECTOR, HAVE PROVIDED POWERFUL RESOURCES FOR HIGHWAY SAFETY ACROSS THE STATE.
