LADIES AND GENTLEMEN, WITH THIS ACQUISITION WE HERALD YET AGAIN OUR DETERMINATION TO ENSURE THAT THE FUTURE WISCONSIN IS AS BEAUTIFUL AS THE PRESENT.

WE ANNOUNCE ONCE AGAIN THAT WE TAKE RESPONSIBILITY FOR PRESERVING AND PROTECTING THE NATURAL RESOURCES WE ARE BLESSED WITH.

WE MAKE IT CLEAR THAT NO SHORT-TERM INTEREST WILL PREVENT US FROM PROTECTING THOSE SPECIAL, IRREPLACEABLE DOMINIONS OF NATURE.
