History:

1892-1904	Jesuits (Turin and Canada Provinces) visited Alakanuk (Eskimo) from St. Mary's, Akulurak
1904-1943	Jesuits (California Province) established and attended St. Ignatius Mission (Eskimo) from St. Mary's, Akulurak
1943-1951	Jesuits (now Oregon Province, Portland, Oregon) attended St. Ignatius from Sacred Heart, Sheldon Point, and Emmonak and other locations
1951-1952	St. Ignatius was destroyed by flooding and rebuilt
1954-present	Became a parish; Jesuits have administered St. Ignatius Church

Holdings of Catholic-related records about Native Americans:

Inclusive dates: 1892-present

Volume: Approximately 1 cubic foot (10 volumes)

Description: Sacramental records (some copies) for St. Ignatius Church, including baptisms, first communions, confirmations, marriages, and deaths.
