Access: Some restrictions apply

History: Holy Name Church is a partially Indian parish.

1902-1907	Jesuits (California Province) visited Ketchikan (Tlingit and Haida)
1907-1930	Jesuits (formerly California; now Oregon Province, Portland, Oregon) established and administered Holy Name Church (Tlingit and Haida)
1930-1964	Jesuits administered Holy Name
1964-1968	A Vincentian (presumably Western Province, Perryville, Missouri) administered Holy Name
1970s-1988, 1995-present	Diocesan priests have administered Holy Name
1988-1995	Oblates of Mary Immaculate (formerly Pacific; now United States Province, Washington, D.C.) administered Holy Name

Various priests from Holy Name attended the following Indian missions:

1904-present	Holy Family Mission (Tlingit and Haida), Metlakata
1909-1930 (became a parish)	St. Rose of Lima Mission (Tlingit), Wrangell/ Fort Wrangel

Holdings of Catholic-related records about Native Americans:
