History:

ca. 1895	Jesuits visited Scammon Bay (Eskimo) from St. Mary's Akulurak
ca. 1930-1990	Jesuits (Oregon Province, Portland, Oregon) established and attended Blessed Sacrament Mission (Eskimo) from Little Flower, Hooper Bay
1930s	Sisters of the Snows (Eskimo) established and staffed a Catholic school at Scammon Bay
1990-present	Became a parish; Jesuits have administered Blessed Sacrament Church assisted by permanent deacons (Eskimo)
