History: Founded in 1848, the Sisters of the Immaculate Heart of Mary made their first U.S. foundation in 1871. From San Solano Missions, Topawa, the United States Province staffed the following Catholic Indian schools:

1919-1930	Santa Cruz School (Maricopa, Pima, and Tohono O'odham), Tucson; included a few American Indian students
1930-1939 (transferred to Sisters of St. Joseph of Orange)	St. Anthony School (Tohono O'odham), Topawa, Tohono O'odham Reservation
1930-1939 (transferred to Sisters of St. Joseph of Orange)	St. Joseph School (Tohono O'odham), San Miguel, Tohono O'odham Reservation
1930-1939 (transferred to Sisters of St. Joseph of Orange)	Our Lady of Guadalupe School (Tohono O'odham), Cowlic, Tohono O'odham Reservation
1930-1939 (closed)	Our Lady of Lourdes School (Tohono O'odham), Little Tucson, Tohono O'odham Reservation
1930-1939 (transferred to Franciscan Sisters of Christian Charity)	St. Joseph School (Tohono O'odham), Pisinemo, Tohono O'odham Reservation
1932-1936 (transferred to Sisters of St. Joseph of Orange)	St. Aloysius School (Tohono O'odham), Big Fields, Tohono O'odham Reservation
1932-1936 (closed)	Gue Va School (Tohono O'odham), Gue Va, Tohono O'odham Reservation
1932-1939 (transferred to Franciscan Sisters of Christian Charity)	Sacred Heart School (Tohono O'odham), Covered Wells, Tohono O'odham Reservation
