History: St. Mary Basilica/ Immaculate Conception Church is a non-Indian parish that has had a few Pima Indian parishioners. Diocesan priests, 1881-1896, and Franciscans, 1896-present (now Santa Barbara Province, Oakland, California), from St. Mary's have attended the following Indian missions, parishes, and schools:

1885-1914 (transferred to St. John's, Laveen)	Ss. Simon and Jude Mission (Tohono O'odham), Gila Bend
1897-1909 (became a parish)	St. John the Baptist Church (Pima), Laveen, Gila River Reservation
1897-1901 (transferred to Sisters of St. Joseph of Carondelet)	St. John the Baptist School (Pima), Laveen, Gila River Reservation
1902-1912 (transferred to St. John's, Laveen)	St. Francis of Assisi Mission (Pima), Salt River Reservation
1905-1930 (transferred to St. Francis, Phoenix)	Phoenix Government Indian School (various), Phoenix
1906-1909 (transferred to St. John's, Laveen)	St. Anne Mission (Maricopa and Pima), Santan, Gila River Reservation
1906-1909 (transferred to St. John's, Laveen)	St. Michael Mission (Maricopa and Pima), Sacaton Flats, Gila River Reservation
1906-1909 (transferred to St. John's, Laveen)	St. Paschal Mission (Maricopa and Pima), Blackwater
1906-1909 (transferred to St. John's, Laveen)	St. Peter Mission (Maricopa and Pima), Casa Blanca
1906-1926 (transferred to Immaculate Heart, Phoenix)	Our Lady of Guadalupe Mission (Yaqui), Guadalupe
