History: Founded in 1902, St. Michael Indian School (Navajo) is a K-12 school administered by the Sisters of the Blessed Sacrament for Indians and Colored People (Bensalem, Pennsylvania) and attended by Franciscans (formerly St. John the Baptist; now Our Lady of Guadalupe Province, Albuquerque, New Mexico). The high school division began in 1948.

Holdings of Catholic-related records about Native Americans:

Inclusive dates: 1948-present

Volume: Approximately 11 cubic feet

Description: The records at St. Michael Indian School are not arranged according to a classification scheme. Consequently, description is by record type.

A. Transcripts

Inclusive dates: 1948-present

Volume: Approximately 10 cubic feet

Description: Arranged alphabetically by students' surname and there under by first name.

B. Commencement Activities

Inclusive dates: 1962-present

Volume: Approximately 1 cubic foot

Description: Commencement program materials arranged chronologically, 1 folder/ graduation year, re: graduation lists, programs, notes, and photographs on sports and other school activities
