History: The Capuchins Irish Province (Dublin, Ireland) was represented in California, 1893-1979, and succeeded by the Our Lady of Angels Western American Province, 1979-present. The Irish Province administered St. Mary of the Angels Church, Ukiah, which attended to Pomo Indians, Mendocino County, California, 1893-1969.
