History: The Diocese of Fresno was erected in 1967 from part of the Diocese of Monterey-Fresno. In 1999 the Fresno Diocese reported fewer than 1,000 baptized Native American Catholics. The Fresno Diocese and its predecessors have administered the following Indian missions and parishes:

1920-present (Fresno, 1967-present)	St. Edward Mission (Yokuts), Stratford
1926-present (Fresno, 1967-present)	Santa Rosa Mission (Yokuts), Santa Rosa Rancheria
1926-present	St. Rose Mission (Yokuts), Tache Reservation
1933-present (Fresno, 1967-present)	St. Rita Mission (Miwok), Squaw Valley
