History: In 1967, the Diocese of Monterey was reestablished for central California and succeeded the Diocese of Monterey-Fresno. In 1999 the Monterey Diocese reported 2,000 baptized Native American Catholics. The Monterey Diocese and its predecessors administered the following Indian missions:

1770-ca. 1850 (no longer Indian)	Royal Presidio Chapel of San Carlos Borromeo (Ohlone), Monterey
1770-ca. 1850 (no longer Indian)	San Carlos Borromeo de Carmelo Mission (Esselen and Ohlone), Carmel
1771-1882 (closed) (Los Angeles, 1840-1882)	San Antonio de Padua Mission (Chumash and Yokuts), Jolon
1772-1845, 1859-1868 (no longer Indian)	San Luis Obispo de Tolosa Mission (Chumash and Yokuts), San Luis Obispo
1791-ca. 1900 (no longer Indian)	Nuestra Señora de la Soledad Mission (Esselen, Ohlone and Yokuts), Soledad
1791-1834 (closed)	Santa Cruz Mission (Chumash and Ohlone), Santa Cruz
1797-ca. 1900 (no longer Indian)	San Juan Bautista Mission (Miwok, Ohlone and Yokuts), San Juan Bautista
1797-ca. 1900 (no longer Indian)	San Miguel Arcángel Mission (Yokuts), San Miguel
