Inclusive dates: 1518-1821 or later

Description: At least 3 collections include Native Catholic records:

/1 John Batterson Stetson Collection

Volume: 150,000 pages with scant amount Native Catholic

Inclusive dates: 1518-1819

Description: Include records on Franciscan evangelization among the Apalachee and Timucua Indians; Copies of originals held by Archivo General de Indias, Seville, Spain

/2 East Florida Papers

Volume: 178 reels of microfilm with scant amount Native Catholic

Inclusive dates: 1784-1821

Description: Records of the second Spanish Administration of East Florida, which include records on Franciscan evangelization among the Apalachee and Timucua Indians; U.S. Library of Congress holds the original records, which were seized by the United States in 1821

/3 Papeles Procedentes de Cuba

Volume: 761 reels of microfilm

Inclusive dates: 1760-1821

Description: Spanish government records of East and West Florida, which include records on Franciscan evangelization among the Apalachee and Timucua Indians; originals held by Archivo General de Indias, Seville, Spain

These and other collections (mostly copies) pertain at least in part to evangelization among the Apalachee and Timucua Indians by the Franciscans, Santa Elena de la Florida Province (St. Augustine, Florida).
