History: The Vincentians (Congregation of the Mission) were founded in France in 1625. They established their first U.S. foundation in 1818 and erected the Midwest Province in 1888.

Holdings of Catholic-related records about Native Americans:

Inclusive dates: Between 1812-1954, 1999

Volume: Less than 1 cubic foot

Description: The "DeAndreis-Rosati Memorial Archives" contains the records of the Vincentians Midwest Province, which includes 2 series with Native Catholic records:

/1 "Personnel Records"

Inclusive dates: 1953, 1999

Volume: 1 folder

Description: Reverend John Q. O'Connell, C.M. (1921-1999), 1953, 1999; 1 folder; re: biographical sheet, news clipping, correspondence, photograph, and obituary noting his pastoral work with the Kateri Circle of Colorado and American Indian involvement in his funeral.

/2 "Bishop Joseph Rosati Papers"

Inclusive dates: Between 1812-1954

Volume: Few items within approximately .8 cubic foot

Description: The papers of Bishop Rosati (1789-1843), C.M., of St. Louis, Missouri, are believed to include a few items pertaining to Catholic Indian missions.
