History: The United States Province of the Congregation of the Priests of the Sacred Heart was established in 1933. The Sacred Heart priests and brothers have administered the following Indian missions, parishes, and school in South Dakota:

1933-1958 (closed)	St. Catherine Mission (unknown), Four Bears
