History:

- 1980-1988 (closed) Siggenauk Center (Menominee, Ojibwa, and others), Milwaukee, was established under the auspices of the Archdiocese of Milwaukee with Sister Margaret Troy, S.S.M., as director; sacraments were celebrated and recorded at the following parishes, which assisted the Siggenauk Center: Christ the King Church, Wauwatosa, Holy Spirit Church, Milwaukee (now closed), St. Barbara Church, Milwaukee (now closed), St. Mathew Church, Milwaukee (now closed), and St. Michael Church, Milwaukee
- 1988-present The Congregation of the Great Spirit (Menominee, Ojibwa, and others) succeeded the Siggenauk Center and became a parish administered by a diocesan priest
- 1988-present The Siggenauk Interfaith Spiritual Center was established by the Congregation of the Great Spirit in collaboration with other local native religious groups
- 1988-2004 (closed) Siggenauk Interfaith Spiritual Center (various), Milwaukee, established and administered by Congregation of the Great Spirit in collaboration with other local Indian religious groups
