MUSG Diversity Commission Invites Students to Dinner and Dialogue For “At the Intersection: Sexuality and Religion”

MILWAUKEE –Oct. 8, 2009– Marquette University Student Government will host “At the Intersection: Sexuality and Religion,” on Oct. 15 at 6 p.m. in AMU 163. This event will include free dinner and dialogue that explores the relationship between sexuality and religion in today’s society.

The “At the Intersection” event will be conversation and reflection driven. After the panelists have completed their discussion of these topics, they will ask for questions from the audience. Students are encouraged to bring questions.
