 - A. Chief Larry Rickard, Public Safety Director
 - i. Department of Public safety
 - 1. Stresses respect to the student
 - 2. Close cooperation with local law enforcement
 - 3. Responds to crimes n progress, calls fro service and medical emergencies
 - ii. Patrol area
 - 1. need to cover all areas out of campus to provide safety
 - iii. Preventive services
 - 1. crime prevention
 - 2. victim/witness services
 - 3. investigations
 - a. good investigator
 - b. have new assistant chief that going to assign detective in the area
 - 4. tenant landlords is always important
 - iv. Set up camera system: Command Information Center (July 2007)
 - 1. have cameras with blue light phones
 - 2. a deterrent to help keep campus safe
 - 3. When have criminal element, to come in to commit crime and leave off campus when done
 - 4. want to be proactive with cameras
 - 5. 300 blue lights phones
 - v. Asses control and alarm system integrated into Marquette University
 - 1. locking any door in the building automatically: lock downs
 - vi. Increased cameras around campus
 - vii. Command information center area
 - 1. added new technology into the system
 - 2. 2 additional NVRs have been added
 - 3. live video screens

- viii. Avenues West Substation
 - 1. city connected
 - 2. write a report and keep them into the area for patrol
 - 3. Public safety is keeping a close connection with them
- ix. Manpower increases
 - 1. reason: to reduce the time of action if act were to occur
 - 2. trained officers
- x. Ongoing programs
 - 1. Teaching programs: self defense, personal safety, new student and employee orientation, alcohol awareness, etc.
 - 2. call for appointment
- xi. Crime prevention programming
 - 1. idea of students
 - a. door hangers on all doors for all steps to keep student safe
 - b. created Facebook page to inform students
- xii. Global positioning Chip Wire technology
 - 1. anything that crosses in between the area of O'Donnell and Mashuda will trigger screens at 2am or 3am
- xiii. 3 types of alerts
 - 1. Marquette News Briefs
 - a. General crime prevention information
 - 2. Campus Safety Alerts
 - a. Ongoing safety concern which may distributed via e-mail or flyers
 - b. Robberies that don't catch person, then public safety puts up a report to inform students
 - i. Work with Milwaukee Police Department
 - 3. Text Messaging (Text MU)
 - a. Imminent danger to the MU community
 - b. Active shooter
 - c. Not txt for active robberies
 - d. Txt for school closing information
 - i. encourage constituents to sign up
- xiv. Will put student safety first

- i. Is there anything different from robberies past weekend because of locations being farther?
 - 1. Looking to put up more cameras in isolated areas and thinking of getting more cameras and lighting
 - 2. Students need to be more responsible about their safety and need to be more aware about their area
