AVAILABLE SCHOLARSHIPS FOR FULL-TIME UNDERGRADUATE STUDENTS

SCHOLARSHIPS SPECIFIC TO INCOMING FRESHMAN

- *Ann B. Druml Scholarship*

For an incoming freshman from Divine Savior Holy Angels High School; award is made for freshman academic year; College of Nursing determines recipient based on University admission application.

- *Florence Brady-Murray Scholarship*

For an incoming freshman from north-central Ohio (must be from Fremont, Vickery, Clyde, Sandusky areas, OR natives of Ireland); demonstrates financial need.

- *Nancy Long Pesiri Scholarship (next award in Fall 2008)*

Scholarship competition for full tuition for 4 years to an incoming freshman; award is given every 4 years, next award will be given in 2008; College of Nursing determines recipient based on University admission application.

SCHOLARSHIPS SPECIFIC TO JUNIORS

- *David B. Rowe Memorial Scholarship*

For a current junior student enrolled in nursing clinicals with a cumulative 3.0 GPA or better; participation in community service; intention to work with clients with communicable diseases; commitment to keep the donor informed of career development; demonstrates financial need; submit application form by Oct. 15th; decision will be made early Nov.; award will be applied to fall term.

- *McGrath Scholarship*

For an incoming junior who will be enrolled in nursing clinicals with a cumulative 3.0 GPA or better; demonstrates financial need.

SCHOLARSHIP SPECIFIC TO SENIORS

- *Mary Catherine Foley Scholarship*

For an incoming senior student who overcame great obstacles; demonstrates financial need; submit application form by Sept. 15th; decision will be made early Oct.; award will be applied to fall term.

SCHOLARSHIPS SPECIFIC TO UNDERREPRESENTED STUDENTS

- *Kathleen Powers Memorial Minority Scholarship*

For a minority student who demonstrates financial need; merit-based with a cumulative 3.0 GPA.

For socially or economically disadvantaged minority women; spring term renewal is contingent on a cumulative 2.5 GPA and continuation in Nursing major.
