I. Study Abroad Program:

II. Service Learning Programs:

Overseas service projects that have an associated Marquette University course requirement for student participation in the program.

A. South Africa Service Learning Program.

A semester long, international service learning opportunity in Cape Town, South Africa which combines academic studies with direct immersion into the local culture. Program focuses on leadership paradigms and qualities needed for a more peaceful world while becoming a catalyst for positive change. In addition to the service requirement, while in Cape Town students will take 12-15 credit hours with South African professors from the Leadership Academy of the Desmond Tutu Peace Centre (www.tutu.org) and the University of the Western Cape (UWC) (www.uwc.ac.za).

Marquette University course requirement: History 007: History of Africa (must be completed prior to departure to South Africa).

B. Marquette University Latin American Service Learning Program

These programs support the Health, Environment, and Infrastructure in Latin America (HEILA) initiatives. The programs are coordinated by faculty members from the College of Engineering and the College of Health Sciences. Participants have an opportunity to perform a 7 to 14 day service learning project during the winter or spring breaks in countries such as El Salvador, Guatemala, and Honduras. Participants provide service and become immersed into the environment of the local inhabitants. A significant part of the experience involves reflection and discussion regarding social justice in developing countries.

The HEILA programs are focused in two areas:

1. Engineering projects coordinated with PAVA (el Programa de Ayuda para los Vecinos del Altiplano) and in the future some of the projects will be coordinated with Engineers without Borders.
2. Health Service projects are conducted in conjunction with Global Medical Relief (www.globalmr.org).

Both programs are open to all Marquette University students.

Marquette University currently coordinates two trips during both the winter break and spring break while trips may also occur at the end of the spring semester. Normally one of the trips focuses on an engineering project and the other trip focuses on providing health services to the local community.

C. Physician Assistant Program in Belize, Central America

Students in the final year of education in the Physician Assistant Program may elect to spend four weeks in an underserved province of Belize, Central American.

The Department of Physician Assistant Studies has partnered with the Department of Family Medicine at the Medical College of Wisconsin to offer Physician Assistant students to join medical students in a unique tropical medicine experience among the underserved native populations.

Students spend four weeks treating Mayan Indian populations in the Toledo district in the most southern part of the country. Students are placed at the Hillside clinic in the Caribbean shore town of Punta Gorda and are supervised by the full-time in house physician and staff. Included in this experience are day trips to neighboring villages and other semi-remote locations.

SUMMARY OF STUDY ABROAD PROGRAMS OFFERED BY MARQUETTE UNIVERSITY COLLEGE OF ARTS AND SCIENCES

Marquette Sponsored Programs

Marquette Study Center in Madrid, Spain

Comprehensive semester or year-long study abroad program focusing on immersion in Spanish language and culture. Program is geared toward students at the advanced intermediate level wishing to achieve fluency in the Spanish language. Courses are offered in the liberal arts and are taught in Spanish by professors from the Universidad Complutense de Madrid. Students are placed in home stays with Spaniards throughout Madrid. Cultural immersion is enhanced through program-sponsored excursions to other cities and regions in Spain, and through social activities in Madrid. The program includes a multi-week orientation prior to program begin. A Marquette faculty member is appointed for a two-year term as on-site resident director. Tuition is paid to Marquette; grants, scholarships and federal financial aid apply.

Summer program at the University of Veracruz

The Marquette University program at the University of Veracruz in Xalapa, Mexico provides college student and Spanish teachers the opportunity to earn college credit while being immerse in the Hispanic culture. Students can earn 3, 6, or 9 credits. The six-week intensive program includes formal classes conducted by professors and the University of Veracruz. Students live in private homes with Mexican families and have an opportunity for constant language practice. Trips are offered to the famous ruins of Teotihuacan and Tajin.

Australearn (Australia and New Zealand)

Australearn is a comprehensive study abroad program provider affiliated with twenty-two universities in Australia and New Zealand. Australearn facilitates the enrollment of US students in their choice of universities for a semester or a year, in addition to offering services such as in-country orientation, arranged housing, and on-site support.

Australearn also sponsors summer study abroad programs. This is a Marquette affiliated program: federal loans and grants apply, however Marquette grants and scholarships do not.

Center for Education Abroad at Arcadia University

Arcadia University is a comprehensive study abroad program provider that offers programs in England, Scotland, Greece, Australia, or New Zealand. In addition to study opportunities, Arcadia offers internships in London, Canberra, and Sydney. The program offers comprehensive services, including an in-country orientation, housing arranged by the program, and on-site support. This is a Marquette affiliated program: federal loans and grants apply, however Marquette grants and scholarships do not.

The Beijing Center for Language and Culture, Beijing China

The Beijing Center, sponsored by the Association of Jesuit Colleges and Universities, is designed for integrated learning both in and out of the classroom. Students spend their time in intensive Chinese language courses, and in courses related to culture, business, history, politics, philosophy, theology, and more. Extensive travel throughout China is devoted to learning about the culture first-hand. This is a Marquette affiliated program: federal loans and grants apply, however Marquette grants and scholarships do not. Students may apply for competitive scholarships through the Freeman-Asia Foundation.

Rome Center for Liberal Arts

In cooperation with Loyola University Chicago, students may study abroad in Rome, Italy through the Rome Center exchange program. The Rome Center offers courses in the liberal arts as well as Italian studies. No prior knowledge in Italian is required; however students must take one Italian course on site. The programs are open to second-semester sophomores and beyond who have maintained a 2.75 GPA or above and are in good academic and social standing. Courses are taught in English; students live on campus at the Rome Center. Optional travel is organized by the program. This is a Marquette University exchange program: Marquette tuition is charged; scholarships, grants, and federal financial aid apply. Housing costs are paid directly to the Loyola Rome Center.

School for International Training

The School for International Training (SIT) is a comprehensive study abroad program that offers field-based, academic programs in over 40 countries in Africa, Europe, Latin America, Asia and the Pacific. The program consists of introductory language study, interdisciplinary seminars, independent fieldwork, and culminates with a directed study project. With the exception of the language course, all coursework is taught in English. Students live with local families. This is an affiliated study abroad program; Marquette scholarships and grants do not apply; federal aid is applicable.

UWM-Notre Dame-Marquette Study Program in Chile

In cooperation with the University of Wisconsin—Milwaukee and Notre Dame, this program combines courses for U.S. students with direct enrollment at the Pontificia Universidad Catolica de Chile in Santiago, Chile. Students live in homes with local Chilean host families. An optional pre-session orientation program focusing on Spanish language review and Chilean culture is offered in neighboring rural Linares. An optional semester-long service-learning program is also available. All courses are taught in Spanish; students should have completed the equivalent of 5 semesters of college Spanish prior to the program begin. This is an affiliated study abroad program. Marquette grants and scholarships do not apply; federal financial

EXCHANGE PROGRAMS

Marquette has developed numerous exchange agreements with universities abroad. Under these agreements, students pay tuition to Marquette but study at a partner university abroad. Marquette's exchange programs listed below are administered by the College of Business Administration Study Abroad Office (David A. Straz, Jr. Hall Room 101, (414) 288-5151), and are available to all Marquette University students.

AUSTRALIA

Monash University

Located in Melbourne Australia, Monash is a comprehensive university offering courses in most major fields. This program is open to all university students with junior standing and a minimum of 3.0 QPA. The semesters run from July to mid-November and Mid-February to June. University housing available, Marquette tuition, most forms of financial aid apply, visa required.

AUSTRIA

University of Innsbruck

This comprehensive university offers courses in most major fields. This program is open to all university juniors with a minimum 2.75 QPA and strong German language proficiency. The semesters run from October to mid-January and March to late June. University housing available, Marquette tuition, most forms of financial aid apply, three German courses beyond GERM 004 or GERM 010 required, visa required.

BELGIUM

University of Antwerp – UFSIA

Located in the heart of the port city of Antwerp, UFSIA offers English instructional courses in a selection of business and economics courses. As such, this university is more suitable for business students in their junior year with good academic standing. Semesters run from September to mid-January and February to late June. Limited University housing available, Marquette tuition, most forms of financial aid apply, visa is required.

CANADA

Laval University

Laval is located in the capital city of Quebec. Two options are available at Laval: Summer French Language courses and semester or year study abroad. Two summer sessions run from mid-May to late June and July to mid August (some French proficiency is needed to take the placement exam). Some scholarships may be available for summer sessions.

The semester/year study abroad is available to juniors in most fields with good academic standing and strong French proficiency. Semesters run from September to mid-December and January to mid-May. University housing available, most forms of financial aid apply, three French courses beyond FREN 004 or FREN 010 are required for the semester/year studies, FREN 002 required for summer language studies, visa required for semester/year studies.

CHILE

Pontificia Universidad Catolica de Chile (PUC)

Located in Santiago, Chile, PUC is a comprehensive university offering most majors. PUC is available to all Marquette students in their junior year with strong Spanish language proficiency and in good academic standing. The academic year runs from October to late June and the spring semester runs from March to late June (fall only is not feasible). University housing available, Marquette tuition, most forms of financial aid apply, three Spanish courses beyond SPAN 004 or SPAN 010 required, visa required.

DENMARK

Southern Denmark Business School

The Sonderborg campus of this university offers English instructional classes in business. Junior business students in good academic standing may apply for this program, which runs from August to mid-December and January to mid-June. Private apartments, Marquette tuition, most forms of financial aid apply, visa required.

FRANCE

Catholic University of Lille

This university which offers most majors is located in Lille, France. One of its business schools, Ieseg, offers a limited number of business classes in English. Strong French language proficiency is required to apply for this program. The semesters run from September to mid-January and from February to mid-June. University housing available, Marquette tuition, most forms of financial aid apply, three French Language course beyond FREN 004 or FREN 010 required, visa required.

Catholic University of Lyon

This university which offers most majors is located in Lyon, France. Its business school, Esdes, offers a limited number of business classes in English. Strong French language proficiency is required to apply for this program. The semesters run from September to mid-January and from February to mid-June. Limited University sponsored housing available, Marquette tuition, most forms of financial aid apply, three French Language course beyond FREN 004 or FREN 010 required, visa required.

Universite Robert Schuman, Strasbourg (IECS)

Strasbourg, in the Alsace region of France is the home to this university. This exchange program is available to business students with strong French Language proficiency only. A limited number of business classes are offered in English. The semesters run from September to mid-January and from February to mid-June. IECS offers a summer program with business courses taught in English, which runs during the month of June. Some basic French background is needed to participate in the summer program. Private housing, Marquette tuition, most forms of financial aid apply, three French Language course beyond FREN 004 or FREN 010 required for the semester/year studies, visa required.

GERMANY

Katholische Universitat Eichstatt

The university is located in Eichstatt while the business school is located in Ingolstadt, both near Munich, Germany. Business classes at the Ingolstadt Campus are both in English and in German while the classes offered in most other majors at the Eichstatt Campus are in German only. University provided residence halls are available in both locations. The semesters run from October to late March and from April to late July (i.e., a one-semester study abroad is only feasible in the second semester, i.e., April to July). University housing available, Marquette tuition, most forms of financial aid apply, three German courses beyond GERM 004 or GERM 010 required for the semester/year studies, visa required.

Phillipps Universitat – Marburg

This is a major university offering courses in most majors. Courses are in German and, therefore, strong German proficiency is required. The semesters run from September to February and March to late-June. University housing available, Marquette tuition, most forms of financial aid apply, three German courses beyond GERM 004 or GERM 010 required for the semester/year studies, visa required.

IRELAND

National University of Ireland – Galway

This comprehensive university offers courses in most majors. The QPA requirement for this program is strictly 3.0 and higher. Marquette students usually use private apartments while studying at NUI – Galway. University housing available (private housing more common), sophomore standing, Marquette tuition, some financial aid applies.

JAPAN

Sophia University

Students may study a full year, during the spring semester, or in summer at Sophia University located in Tokyo, Japan. Courses are available in humanities, philosophy, theology, business, and economics. University housing is available in this expensive city (cost of living during the semester, including housing exceeds \$8,000). The academic year runs from September through July and the second semester is from March to July (fall semester only is, therefore, not feasible). University housing available, Marquette tuition, most forms of financial aid apply, some knowledge of Japanese (i.e., JAPA 002) required, visa required for semester/year studies.

MEXICO

Universidad Iberoamericana

Courses are offered in most majors at this comprehensive university. All courses are in Spanish, therefore, a minimum of three courses beyond SPAN 004 or SPAN 010 required for this program. Semesters run from September to December and from February to June. University housing is available. Summer school is available at Iberoamericana. University housing available, three courses beyond SPAN 004 or SPAN 010 required, Marquette tuition, most forms of financial aid apply, visa required for semester/year studies.

PUERTO RICO

Universidad del Sagrado Corazon

The Sacred Heart University is located in San Juan, Puerto Rico. Many majors are offered. Strong Spanish Language proficiency is required for this program. Semesters run from September through December and from January through June. University housing available, Marquette tuition, most forms of financial aid apply, three Spanish courses beyond SPAN 004 or SPAN 010 required.

SPAIN

Universidad Pontificia Comillas – ICADE/ICAI

Located near central Madrid ICADE and ICAI are the business & economics and engineering schools of this Jesuit university, respectively. Courses are offered in most fields at these two campuses as well as the main campus on the outskirts of Madrid. All classes are in Spanish; therefore, strong Spanish proficiency is required. Independent housing is available around the campuses. Semesters run from September to mid-January and from late-February through early July. University housing available, three courses beyond SPAN 004 or SPAN 010 required, Marquette tuition, most forms of financial aid apply, visa required for semester/year studies.

Universidad de Deusto – San Sebastian & Bilbao

This comprehensive university offers courses in Spanish in most majors. The San Sebastian Campus is most suitable for business and economics majors and the Bilbao Campus for most other majors. Nearly all classes are in Spanish; therefore, strong Spanish proficiency is required. University sponsored independent housing is available. Semesters run from September to mid-January and from late February through early July. University housing available, three courses beyond SPAN 004 or SPAN 010 required, Marquette tuition, most forms of financial aid apply, visa required for semester/year studies.

Institucion Universitaria de la Compania de Jesus (ETEA)

Our exchange program is with ETEA, the business school of this Jesuit University only. Classes are nearly all in Spanish; therefore, strong Spanish proficiency is required. Semesters run from September to mid-January and late-February through early July. University residence halls and independent housing is available. Private housing, three courses beyond SPAN 004 or SPAN 010 required, Marquette tuition, most forms of financial aid apply, visa required for semester/year studies.

AFFILIATED PROGRAMS

The following affiliate programs are administered by the College of Business Administration and are available to all Marquette University students. These programs are also available to qualified non-Marquette students.

AUSTRALIA

Macquarie University - Sydney

Located in Sydney, Macquarie University is a modern, sophisticated institution that prides itself on innovative programs, outstanding academic achievement and high quality research. It enrolls more than 25,000 students including over 5,000 international students. Macquarie is emerging as one of the most international universities in the world in terms of that proportion of the total student body which is from overseas. This institution offers courses in most areas including, arts and sciences, humanities, social sciences, business and economics, engineering, communications, journalism, health sciences and nursing. The minimum QPA requirement to apply to Macquarie is 2.5. Semesters run from mid February through June and from early July through November. The tuition is about \$5,400 per semester and housing is about \$2,200. Marquette financial aid does not apply, most other forms of financial aid apply. ITALY

John Cabot University – Rome

Located in Rome, John Cabot University (JCU) is an independent, accredited four-year college of liberal arts and sciences, with an international degree-seeking student body and over 120 courses from which to choose. Travel in Italy, classes on site at famous monuments and museums throughout the city and a range of extra-curricular activities are just some of the enhancements of John Cabot's program. Students visiting from the United States meet others from Europe, Latin America, Asia, the Middle East and Africa, as well as the majority of Italian 4-year students. Study Abroad students typically share rooms in the characteristic apartments in the area arranged by the university. Total immersion in the Roman way of life brings new understanding and appreciation of how others live. The minimum QPA requirement to apply to JCU is 3.0. Semesters run from late August through mid December and from early January through mid May. The tuition is about \$6,200 per semester and housing package including a range of services and amenities is about \$4,200. Marquette financial aid does not apply, most other forms of financial aid apply. For information, contact College of Business Administration Study Abroad Office (David A. UNITED KINGDOM

City University – London

Located in central London near the business district City University is a well-known institution with several of its academic programs consistently ranking among the top three in the UK. This program is most suitable for business, communications, and engineering and computer science students with minimum QPA of 3.0. Semesters run from September to December and January to April. Tuition for spring semester is approximately \$6,500 and housing is approximately \$2,600. Limited University housing available, Sophomore standing, Tuition approximately \$6,500, Marquette financial aid does not apply, most other forms of financial aid apply, Most suitable for business, communication, engineering, and computer science majors. St. Clare's – Oxford

The Liberal Arts Programme of St. Clare's–Oxford offers arts and sciences, humanities, and business and economics classes primarily to American as well as a small number of international students. Several excursions and cultural activities are organized for the students throughout the semester. The tuition for 2003-2004 is approximately \$10,000 and housing is approximately \$2,800. Marquette aid does not apply to this program. The semesters run from early September to mid-December and early January to mid-May. College housing available, sophomore standing, Tuition Approximately \$10,000, Marquette financial aid does not apply, most other forms of financial aid apply, most suitable for Arts & Sciences, Business, Health Sciences, and Nursing majors. SUMMER AND INTERSESSION PROGRAMS

Presently, the College of Business Administration conducts summer programs in Belgium (Antwerp), Quebec City, Canada, Strasbourg, France, Rome, Italy, Tokyo, Japan, and Mexico City, Mexico, as well as an intersession program (in December and January) in the Czech Republic.

Summer Undergraduate Business Program in Antwerp, Belgium

This program provides students with an opportunity to study economic integration in the context of the European Union (EU). In addition to the seminars taught in English by the faculty of the University of Antwerp, the program will include presentations by experts from business, industry and the EU institutions. Eligibility: Admitted undergraduate student in the College of Business in good academic standing with a QPA of 2.5 or higher.

Summer Graduate Business Program in Galway, Ireland

This course provides students with an opportunity to study business and economic, social, cultural and political issue in Ireland and, generally, in the European Union. The course includes two parts: 1) Classes held at Marquette (approximately 18 hours of class time), and 2) European Study Trip (9 days in ***Ireland***). While in Ireland, students will experience seminars taught by the faculty of the ***National University of Ireland, Galway***, as well as presentations by experts and executives from business, industry and/or government. Eligibility: Must be an admitted Marquette University graduate business student (MBA, MSAE, MSEM, MSA, or MSHR), as a degree student in good standing.

Summer Graduate Business Program in Antwerp, Belgium

This program provides students with an opportunity to study economic integration in the context of the European Union (EU). In addition to the seminars taught in English by the faculty of the University of Antwerp, the program will include presentations by experts from business, industry and the EU institutions. Eligibility: Admitted graduate student in the College of Business in good academic standing; at least five years of work experience. This program is required for all Executive MBA students.

Summer Undergraduate Program in Strasbourg, France

In partnership with Robert Schuman School of Business (IECS) this program is offered during the month of June in Strasbourg, France. Business and economics classes are offered during this session as well as a French Language class. This program is available to all Marquette University students.

Summer Undergraduate Program in Rome, Italy

In partnership with John Cabot University, undergraduate summer programs are offered during two summer sessions in Rome, Italy. A selection of arts & sciences (art, history, political science, English, Italian, philosophy, and religion), computer science, business, and economics classes are offered during each session. Self-catered, standard, shared apartment housing is provided in the city near the campus for the duration of the study. This program is available to all Marquette University students.

Summer Undergraduate Program in Tokyo, Japan

In partnership with Sophia University, undergraduate summer programs are offered during summer in Tokyo, Japan. A selection of arts & sciences (history, political science, sociology, religion, and Japanese language and literature), business and economics classes are offered. This program is available to all Marquette University students.

Summer Undergraduate Program in Mexico City, Mexico

In partnership with Iberoamericana University, undergraduate summer programs are offered during summer in Mexico City, Mexico. Two types of programs are offered: 1) Spanish language and, 2) regular academic programs across all available fields at Iberoamericana. These programs are available to all Marquette University students.
