Information for the sponsor

Marquette University complies with U.S. government financial regulations in two steps. First, we receive from the financial sponsor a statement such as the *Sponsorship Form* printed on the other side of this paper to guarantee full financial support. Second, after the student is officially accepted for studies, we receive from the sponsor an advance deposit of money toward the first term (semester) of tuition and health insurance.

The *Sponsorship Form* which we now need from you has two parts. Part I is your guarantee of full financial sponsorship for the student's living and studies here. You can use the form on the back of this paper, or you can make your own statement to indicate all of the same assurances regarding your full support for this student. Part II is an official's attestation that you are truly the person who has signed Part I. (In some countries, bankers or other officials may prefer to issue their own certification statements instead of using Part II.) This financial statement is for university use, and the U.S. government may require different financial evidence for the student to obtain a visa.

The overall cost to attend Marquette is considered to be the sum of tuition (classroom instruction) during one academic year (nine months) plus the cost of living expenses for one calendar year (12 months). Living expenses include food, housing, clothing, books and supplies, health insurance, Student Activity Fee, Student Health Service Fee, some entertainment costs and many personal items. The cost of undergraduate tuition for the 2007-08 academic year is \$26,270. The cost of basic living and incidental expenses for 12 months from August 2007 to August 2008 is estimated at \$15,720. Thus, the overall cost estimate for 2007-08 is \$41,990.

Some students spend more money per year and others spend slightly less. The estimated costs are expected to increase with inflation each year. The length of study for a bachelor's degree is normally four years. Students who have already completed some advanced studies elsewhere may receive transfer credit toward completion of their Marquette degrees in less time, and other students may need more than four years to complete their studies.

After the student is admitted for studies and before we issue the necessary Form I-20 for the student's governmental arrangements, the sponsor provides an advance deposit of money as evidence of the support that has been guaranteed on the *Sponsorship Form*. A sponsor has two options for this deposit. The first option is to send a payment equal to the first term of tuition and insurance, plus a deposit for housing. For 2007-08 this full advance deposit is normally \$13,645. We will indicate the exact amount of the deposit when the student is accepted for studies, and then we will indicate on the Form I-20 the full deposit that has been paid. For 2007-08, all of the advance deposit except \$400 will be refundable if the student decides not to enroll here. The complete deposit, including the \$400, is refundable in the very unusual event that the U.S. government denies the student's visa application to study at Marquette.

The second option, in place of the full-deposit option, is to provide a much smaller deposit of money and to send in addition a current, official bank statement for the account of the student's official sponsor that indicates an actual bank balance equal to at least the full amount of money for the student's first year of estimated expenses (\$41,990). For 2007-08, this smaller deposit to accompany the full bank statement is normally \$710, which consists of \$200 toward tuition, \$200 toward housing and \$310 toward health insurance.

An advance deposit for full payment may be reduced for scholarship recipients and may be waived for fully funded foreign-government scholars.
