\* Excluded are distance learning classes, noncredit classes, individual instruction such as dissertation or thesis research, music instruction, or one-to-one readings, independent study, co-operative programs, internships, foreign language taped tutor sessions, practicum, and all students in one-on-one classes. Each class section is counted only once and should not be duplicated because of course catalog cross-listings.
