Student credit hours are classified by college offering the course, not by the student enrolled in the class. Other includes Reserve Officer Training Corps, Office of International Education, and Graduate School student credit hours.

Regardless of the subject of the class, student credit hours of classes with section numbers corresponding to the Professional Studies have been moved to the Professional Studies.

Credit hours of students who have withdrawn prior to the census date and students who are auditing the class have been excluded from student credit hour statistics starting in spring 2007.

The course level is determined by the catalog number of the course, where lower undergraduate classes have a catalog number less than 100, upper undergraduate classes have a catalog number less than 200 and graduate/professional classes have a catalog number greater than or equal to 200.

The course level is determined by the catalog number of the course. In fall 2009, the university moved to a new course numbering system. The level of a course in the new system may be different from its level in the old system.
