Helpful Hints for Preparing for & Preventing the Flu

- Practice good hand hygiene by washing your hands often with soap and water, especially after coughing or sneezing. Alcohol based hand cleaners are also effective.
- Frequently clean your living quarters. Be sure to clean commonly used surfaces such as doorknobs, refrigerator handles, remote controls, computer keyboards, countertops, faucet handles and bathroom areas.
- Cover your mouth and nose with a tissue when you cough or sneeze. If you don't have a tissue, cough or sneeze into your elbow or shoulder; not your hands.
- Get your own thermometer and monitor your health by checking for fever and other symptoms of the flu. Symptoms of the flu include a fever AND cough or sore throat. You may also have headache, body aches and extreme tiredness.
- If you are sick with symptoms of the flu, do not attend class, work or school functions until you no longer have a fever for 24 hours.
- Get vaccinated against seasonal influenza to minimize your risk of seasonal flu.
- Avoid rubbing your eyes, nose or mouth with your hands. Germs spread easily that way.
