Spring 2004 Greek Report

Membership

- 488 of Marquette's undergraduates are members of social Greek-letter organizations. This number reflects 7.23% of the campus population. By comparison, this percentage was 7.07% in the Spring 2003 and 7.44% in Spring 2002.
- 8.83% of women are Greek – by comparison, this figure was 7.82% in the Spring 2003 and 7.70% in the Spring of 2002.
- 5.27% of men are Greek – by comparison, this figure was 6.12% in the Spring of 2003 and 7.15% in the Spring of 2002.

Scholarship

- Four organizations had chapter GPA's above the all-University average (2.99):, Alpha Chi Omega, Alpha Phi, Alpha Xi Delta, and Kappa Sigma.
- Two sororities had GPA's above the all-women's average (3.05): Alpha Chi Omega and Alpha Xi Delta
- One fraternity had a GPA above the all-men's average (2.90): Kappa Sigma
- All five of the NIC fraternities new member averages were above the first year male average (2.187). The new member average for fraternity men was 2.85.
- All five of the NPC sororities new member average was above the first year student average (2.45). The new member average for sorority women was 3.07.

Community Service

- Chapter service projects resulted in a total of 3286.5 hours of hands-on service to neighborhood and community agencies. This is an increase of 1578 hours from the Fall 2003 semester and is an increase of 1270 hours when compared to the Spring of 2003. A total of 4995 hours of community service were completed by the Greek community throughout the 2003-2004 academic year. This number does not include individual service performed by members or hours spent raising money through philanthropic activities.
- In addition, twelve of the fourteen Greek chapters raised a total of \$7,236 for donations to local and national charities this semester.
- The Interfraternity Council and the Panhellenic Association raised a total of \$3,500 during Greek Week for Hunger Clean-up.
- Throughout the 2003-2004 academic year the Greek community raised a total of \$15,147.84 for local and national charities. This is an increase of \$5969.84 from the 2002-2003 academic year.
- Included in the above numbers and worthy of individual recognition, the women of Alpha Chi Omega who donated nearly 575 hours in community service and raised approximately \$800.00; the men of Sigma Phi Epsilon who donated nearly 488 hours of community service averaging 13.5 hours per member and the men of Sigma Chi fraternity who donated nearly 276 hours of community service and averaged nearly 15.5 hours per member.

Campus Involvement

- 64% of Greek members reported involvement in other campus organizations and 19% serve in campus leadership roles.

Education

- Chapter officers implemented approximately 40 educational programs for their members on topics including ritual, sexual assault awareness, alcohol awareness, leadership retreats, membership intake, resume building and study skills. In addition, a number of chapters presented programs for the broader campus community.
- 850 students from the Greek community attended the 40 educational programs that were offered throughout the Spring 2004 semester.

Judicial

- The IFC and Panhellenic Joint Judicial board heard only 1 case in the Spring 2004 semester. Triangle fraternity was found responsible for violating the risk management policy.
- Sigma Phi Delta became was re-recognized by the Office of Student Development and the Interfraternity Council in May Of 2004. The chapter will be on a two-year probationary period that began in May 2004.
