

MARQUETTE UNIVERSITY
Fall 2002 Greek Report

Membership

- 372 of Marquette's undergraduates are members of social Greek-letter organizations. This number reflects 5.37% of the campus population. By comparison, this percentage was 6.9 in the Fall of 2001 and 6.78% in Fall of 2000.
- 6.03% of women are Greek – by comparison, this figure was 6.8% in the Fall of 2001 and 7.0% in the Fall of 2000.
- 4.57% of men are Greek – by comparison, this figure was 7.02% in the Fall of 2001 and 6.51% in the Fall of 2000.

Scholarship

- Four organizations had chapter GPA's above the all-University average (2.966): Phi Beta Sigma, Alpha Chi Omega, Alpha Phi and Alpha Xi Delta.
- One of the eighteen chapters has designated funds from their chapter budget to provide scholarships to members with outstanding and/or improved academic achievement. This amount totals \$11,000.
- Nine chapter have also implemented a variety of programs designed to improve scholarship, including study hours, incentive awards, and scholarship recognition events.
- Order of Omega reinstated members this semester – 15 new members were inducted into the organization. Four new women and men were elected to the executive board and have begun to make plans for the coming semester to bring in 15 more Greek members and commit to service.

Community Service

- Chapter service projects resulted in a total of 1,822 hours of hands-on service to neighborhood and community agencies. This number does not include individual service performed by members or hours spent raising money through philanthropic activities.
- In addition, six of the eighteen Greek chapter raised \$4,750 for donations to local and national charities this semester.
- Included in the above numbers and worthy of individual recognition, the women of Pi Beta Phi donated nearly 500 hours in efforts and raised \$950.00.
- The Interfraternity Council and the Panhellenic Association co-sponsored Give Us 4 Day and 225 students from the Greek community participated in the event.

Campus Involvement

- 64% of Greek members reported involvement in other campus organizations and 17% serve in campus leadership roles.

Education

- Chapter officers implemented approximately 44 educational programs for their members on topics including ritual, sexual assault awareness, alcohol awareness, leadership retreats, membership intake, resume building and study skills. In addition, a number of chapters presented programs for the broader campus community.

Discipline

The IFC and Panhellenic Association Joint Judicial Board Chairs continued to work to educate the Social Chairs and Risk Management chairs of each chapter on the Greek community's risk reduction policy. In the Fall 2002 semester no chapter appeared before the Greek Judicial Board.

The Iota Pi chapter of Sigma Chi was placed on two 45-day suspensions by their International Headquarters due to violations of the risk management policy and allegations of hazing and vandalism that occurred within the chapter house. Due to the suspension, the Iota Pi chapter of Sigma chi is not currently recognized as a student organization on Marquette's campus and is not an active member of the Interfraternity Council.

Other

- The women of Panhellenic felt a need to commit to their founding values and principles as Greek women and reevaluted and rewrote their constitution and bylaws. A few changes that we made included: a stronger emphasis was placed on developing committees for scholarship and service, and the women restructured their executive board and election process in order to work toward a more equal representation of each chapter on the council

- The women of Panhellenic reevaluated and rewrote their recruitment policies. the women took time to consider what procedures to put in place to recruit more women in to the Greek community. It was determined that there needed to be better training of the Recruitment Counselors, Chapter Presidents and Recruitment Chairs on the logistics of the Formal Membership Recruitment Process. And thus, weekly meetings with the Recruitment Chairs and Chapter Presidents were implemented. Additionally, the women are looking to extend the number of events that they offer from 3 to 4.
