Spring 2003 Greek Report

Membership

- 470 of Marquette's undergraduates are members of social Greek-letter organizations. This number reflects 7.07% of the campus population. By comparison, this percentage was 7.44% in the Spring 2002 and 8.71% in Spring 2001.
- 7.87% of women are Greek – by comparison, this figure was 7.70% in the Spring 2002 and 8.61% in the Spring of 2001.
- 6.12% of men are Greek – by comparison, this figure was 7.15% in the Spring of 2002 and 8.75% in the Spring of 2001.

Scholarship

- Seven organizations had chapter GPA's above the all-University average (2.94):, Alpha Chi Omega, Alpha Phi, Alpha Xi Delta, Pi Beta Phi, Phi Beta Sigma, Sigma Chi and Sigma Gamma Rho.
- Five sororities had GPA's above the all-women's average (3.01): Alpha Chi Omega, Alpha Phi, Alpha Xi Delta, Pi Beta Phi, and Sigma Gamma Rho.
- Three fraternities had GPA's above the all-men's average (2.85): Sigma Chi, Kappa Sigma, and Phi Beta Sigma.
- All six of the NIC fraternities new member averages were above the first year male average (1.84). The new member average for fraternity men was 2.62.
- All five of the NPC sororities new member average was above the first year student average (2.41). The new member average for sorority women was 3.03.

Community Service

- Chapter service projects resulted in a total of 2,016 hours of hands-on service to neighborhood and community agencies. This is an increase of 194 hours from the Fall 2002 semester and is an increase of 235 hours when compared to the Spring of 2002. A total of 3,838 hours of community service were completed by the Greek community throughout the 2002-2003 academic year. This number does not include individual service performed by members or hours spent raising money through philanthropic activities.
- In addition, seven of the nineteen Greek chapters raised a total of \$2,038 for donations to local and national charities this semester. Throughout the 2002-2003 academic year the Greek community raised a total of \$9178.00 for local and national charities.
- Included in the above numbers and worthy of individual recognition, the women of Alpha Chi Omega who donated nearly 500 hours in community service and raised approximately \$500.00; the men of Sigma Phi Epsilon who donated nearly 370 hours of community service averaging 10.8 hours per member and the men of Triangle fraternity who donated nearly 360 hours of community service and averaged nearly 11 hours per member.
- The Interfraternity Council and the Panhellenic Association co-sponsored Greek Week and Greek Airband activities through which they raised nearly \$2,400.00 to donate to Kathy's House.

Campus Involvement

- 64% of Greek members reported involvement in other campus organizations and 23% serve in campus leadership roles.

Education

- Chapter officers implemented approximately 40 educational programs for their members on topics including ritual, sexual assault awareness, alcohol awareness, leadership retreats, membership intake, resume building and study skills. In addition, a number of chapters presented programs for the broader campus community.
- 816 students from the Greek community attended the 40 educational programs that were offered throughout the Spring 2003 semester.

Judicial

- The IFC and Panhellenic Joint Judicial board heard a total of six cases in the Spring 2003 semester. Two meeting attendance cases were dismissed, the organization in one risk management case was found not responsible, and the following three organizations were all found responsible for risk management violations: Sigma Chi, Sigma Phi Epsilon, and Delta Chi.
- Sigma Phi Delta was suspended in May 2003 for one academic year. This decision was part of an outcome from a student conduct hearing which determined that the fraternity was in violation of the Interfraternity Council policies related to sponsoring social events. It was the latest in a series of conduct violations by the fraternity that not only violated IFC policy but also was not in line with the mission of Marquette University.
- The Iota Pi chapter of Sigma Chi was re-recognized by Marquette University and the Interfraternity Council in the Spring of 2003. The chapter is currently in the process of building a chapter committed to their founding values. Sigma Chi was successful in recruiting 3 new members in the Spring of 2003 and attaining a GPA above the all men's average, the all university average, and the IFC average.

- Kappa Sigma, Alpha Xi Delta, Pi Beta Phi, Sigma Phi Epsilon, Triangle and Alpha Chi Omega all sponsored alternative to alcohol programs in the Spring 2003 semester. A total of 42 alternative to alcohol programs were offered by these six organizations and approximately 650 students attended these various events.
