MEAL PLAN AND HOUSING INFORMATION

As a new undergraduate, you are guaranteed on-campus housing. Because of the educational advantages enjoyed by students living in the residence halls, all unmarried first- and second-year students, regardless of their academic classifications, are required to live in university residence halls. Exceptions are only made for students residing with a parent or guardian, students who are at least 21 years of age, or those who have been out of high school for at least two years.

Each application will be randomly ordered during the assignment process. Roommate, room type and hall preferences will be honored to the extent it's possible. We assume that rooming with a preferred roommate is more important than living in a particular building or room type, if not all criteria can be accommodated.

DEPOSIT FORM

To reserve your place for the August 2008 class, please complete and return the enclosed **tuition and housing deposit form** with your \$200 tuition deposit (and your \$200 housing deposit if you wish to live in a residence hall). Make your check or money order payable to Marquette University (do not send cash) and return it in the enclosed envelope by the date indicated on your tuition and housing deposit form. **Do not include funds for the MarquetteCash option at this time.** Any amount selected will be billed to your student account.

Tuition and housing deposits are **non-refundable**. The tuition deposit will be credited toward your first semester tuition costs. The housing deposit will be applied to your first semester housing costs. We'll mail a copy of *The Next Step*, which details what you will need to do to become a Marquette student after we receive your tuition and housing deposit.

TIMELINE

Feb. 1	Scholarship application deadline, marquette.edu/scholarships ; financial aid recommended deadline, fafsa.ed.gov
Mid-March	Merit-based scholarship winners notified; financial aid offers mailed
May 1	Deadline to submit your tuition and housing deposit form or to let Marquette know you have decided to go elsewhere
Early May	Accept financial aid package
Mid-June	Receive information about roommate(s) and assigned residence hall
June 16, 20, 23, 27	PREVIEW: Optional pre-orientation program, marquette.edu/preview
Early July	Receive tentative schedule for Orientation 2008; receive information about refrigerator rentals, insurance, lofts, room sizes, etc.
Mid-July	Start registering for classes through CheckMarq
End of July	Receive first semester bill from the university, if you register for classes in July. If you register for classes in August, bill for fall semester will be mailed in early September.
Early August	Receive housing contract from the Office of Residence Life; receive information from Marquette about credit for advanced placement, international baccalaureate work or college credit transferring to the university (go to marquette.edu/bulletin for credit policy)
Aug. 20	Orientation begins, marquette.edu/orientation
Aug. 25	First day of classes
