Correction to Sept 2010 issue:

Rev. Robert Doran, S.J.: Doran's writing in the area of systematics is being done explicitly against the backdrop of interfaith dialogue. He presented a paper in Boston this past summer, 'Functional Specialties for a World Theology,' which affirms that the data on religious traditions other than our own must now be processed by Catholic theologians as relevant to our theological affirmations and systematic understanding. It is something of a programmatic statement of what the interreligious context means for Catholic theology itself.
