

“Martin Luther: Gatekeeper or Gateway for Ecumenism Today?”

For centuries Luther has been blamed for splitting the church though he was deeply convinced of its unity. Recent historical research has found quite a number of significant texts showing Luther much more convinced of the unity of the church and of a special ministry of papacy to keep that unity. Dr. Markus Wriedt, a German Church historian and ecumenical theologian, will give a public lecture with latest insights to this fascinating research for a more widespread understanding of Luther’s legacy for Christianity.
