Course Title: Theology in the Middle Ages

Description:

The course is a third-level historical area survey of the development of theology in the middle ages. Topics include the Carolingian controversies, the monastic theologians of the early middle ages, and the development of scholastic theology in the cathedral schools and universities of the 12th and 13th centuries. Authors to be studied include Anselm of Canterbury, Peter Abelard, Hugh of St. Victor, Thomas Aquinas, Bonaventure, and others. There will be two exams and two papers.
