Trinity Fellows Program Agency Information Sheet 2010 - 2012 Fellowship Period

The Trinity Fellows Program of Marquette University was created in keeping with an ideal central to the university's mission – the promotion of justice and faith through service – to develop urban leaders with a commitment to social and economic justice.

Trinity Fellows participate in a 21-month study/work program while earning Master's degrees in:

In order to qualify for the program, students must meet the standards of the Marquette University Graduate School and must have completed service in the Peace Corps, Americorps, Jesuit Volunteer Corps or other comparable full-time volunteer service program. Fellows are expected to complete a Master's program in two years, enrolling in approximately nine credits per semester. They are also required to take nine elective credits in the following urban issues courses:

- Nonprofit Organizations: Trends in the Third Sector
- Nature of Cities
- Social Justice/Social Activism

In addition to their full time studies, Fellows work in meaningful, substantive projects designed by selected nonprofit organizations in the Milwaukee area. Fellows work at their nonprofit placements 18 hours per week during the academic year, and 40 hours per week during the summer between academic years. Nonprofit agencies currently involved in the program have uniformly expressed their satisfaction with the high level of professionalism, skill, energy and commitment with which Fellows perform their placement responsibilities. Fellowships include a full tuition scholarship and a monthly stipend for books, health insurance, and other living expenses. Student stipend is currently \$1565 (gross) per month.

Fees: Each participating agency contributes \$1,400 per month for the twenty-one month fellowship period.

Nonprofit Placement term: September 2010 – May 2012

Agency Application Deadline – February 1, 2010
