The **Shadow Days** provides an opportunity to experience two days (one night) in the life of a full-time college student/Cadet. Shadow a current Cadet with a major similar to the one you are interested in, attend Army ROTC physical training, attend ROTC classes and regular academic classes/labs, eat in a university cafeteria and stay in a residence hall, attend a ROTC information session, and enjoy both ROTC and university extracurricular activities. The dates are **November 8-9, 2018 and February 7-8, 2019**.

Army ROTC National High School Scholarship

High School Seniors: Compete for three and four year Army ROTC scholarships for your college of choice!!



- Scholarships are awarded based on a student's merit and grades, not financial need.
- Army ROTC awards about 2,000 scholarships (around 1,000 three year and 1,000 four year) each year to High School Seniors. All eligible H.S. Seniors are invited to compete! - Competing for an Army ROTC scholarship or being awarded a scholarship does NOT obligate a student to contract with ROTC. Awardees have 30 days to accept or decline a scholarship if awarded.

•Timeline: Army ROTC Scholarship Application window opened in June 2018 (between Junior and Senior year); applications must be **initiated before 1159pm EST on 04 February 2019 (in Senior year) & completed (with all 4 criterion met) by 04 March 2019** to be considered. The three submission deadline dates are ~~29 September 2018, 28 December 2018~~ and 04 March 2019.

- There are four steps to the Army ROTC scholarship process:
 - 1) Online application (takes about 30-90 min; includes military aptitude questionnaire and personal statement)
 - 2) Email or submit a) proof of ACT or SAT score AND b) high school transcript with proof of high school cumulative GPA
 - 3) Physical Fitness Assessment (1 minute push ups, 1 minute curl ups, 1 mile run) administered by a Coach or P.E. Teacher
 - 4) On-Campus In-Person Interview with an Army ROTC Instructor**

**Must complete online application and submit ACT/SAT and H.S. transcripts/GPA prior to scheduling ROTC Interview. Students are encouraged (but not required) to interview with the Army ROTC program at the college they would most like to attend college.

Be one of 20 high school juniors and seniors to attend our **Shadow a Cadet Overnight Days** in November 8-9, 2018 OR February 7-8, 2019.
